Sheepshead Bay's Martin Shkreli gets seven years for fraud

He went from the Bay to big house.

Sheepshead Bay's least-favorite son Martin Shkreli will spend the next seven years behind bars, a federal judge announced at his sentencing on March 9 — more than six months after a jury convicted him of fraud for running a multi-million dollar Ponzi scheme under the guise of a hedge fund.

Shkreli will finally be where he belongs after years of stock manipulation and defrauding his investors out of more than \$10 million, said the United States Attorney for the Eastern District of New York.

"Shkreli told lie after lie to steal his inves-

tors' money, manipulate the stock market, and enrich himself," said Richard Donoghue. "He will now pay the price for repeatedly violating the trust placed in him by his investors, his employees, and the public."

Shkreli, the so-called "Pharma Bro" who once ran the drug company Retrophin, earned one of his several nicknames as "The Most Hated Man in America" when he jacked up the price of a drug for AIDS patients from \$13.50 to \$750 per pill overnight in 2015.

He continued to gain infamy when he trolled a journalist and the popular hip-hop group Wu Tang Clan online, then purchased the musicians' one-

of-a-kind album for \$2 million and later tried to sell it on eBay.

He even offered a bounty for a lock of Hillary Clinton's hair in September — prompting judge Kiyo Matsumoto to revoke his bail and send him to the Metropolitan Detention Center in Sunset Park.

But Shkreli stood on trial for none of those many offenses — prosecutors charged the 34-year-old with eight counts of fraud in June, and a 12-person jury convicted him for three of those counts in August.

Before the case kicked off in Brooklyn federal court, several potential jurors — and at one time even Shkreli's own law-

yer Benjamin Brafman — admitted how badly they wanted to sock him in the face. The habitually smirking fraudster is also famed for having one of the world's "most punchable" faces.

No longer smirking, formerly smug Shkreli reportedly sobbed in court prior to his sentencing.

And before March 9, when Shkreli learned his fate in court, Matsumoto forced the former hedge-fund manager to cough up a \$75,000 fine and hand over \$7.3 million in forfeiture — including his Wu Tang Clan album, "Tha Carter V" album by Lil Wayne, and a Picasso painting,

Meet the new boss at the Six-0

YOUTH IN REVOLT

Students demand common-sense gun reform at walkouts across boro

These kids get an A in activism.

Thousands of students rallied for stricter gun laws during school walkouts across the borough on Wednesday — one month to the day that a gunman killed 17 people when he opened fire inside a Florida high school.

“Enough is enough — I want my voice to be heard,” said Tyler Ovenden, a senior at Brooklyn Tech. “There are all these shootings, and no one has spoken up.”

Impassioned pupils from the Fort Greene high school joined kids from Packer Collegiate Institute in Brooklyn Heights, PS 321 and the four schools within the John Jay Educational Campus in Park Slope, Fort Hamilton High School in Bay Ridge, Midwood’s Edward R. Murrow High School, and other borough learning houses at demonstrations across Kings County.

Participants in the 17-minute walkouts — which were timed to reflect the number of lives lost in Florida, but went on for much longer in many cases — brandished signs and shouted chants demanding common-sense gun legislation, including new laws to ensure assault weapons, such as the semi-automatic AR-15 assault rifle the 19-year-old Florida shooter used in his deadly rampage, don’t fall into the wrong hands.

And some young protesters expressed fears that their classrooms could become future targets if legislators do not act.

“As a student, the situation is very scary,” said Tasia Alam, a freshman at Edward R. Murrow. “I would hate to see myself in that situation, and gun control is being handled in a very poor manner.”

The rallies followed Pres-

ident Trump’s decision earlier this week to disavow his previous pledge to push for tighter gun laws and instead move toward a National Rifle Association-backed proposal to arm and train teachers who could defend students during an attack.

But the last thing many local students want is more firearms in classrooms, according to another Brooklyn Tech teen, who said even his educators recoiled at the thought.

“I don’t want my teachers to have guns,” said Nicolas Killmer. “Even my teachers

don’t want to have guns.”

Borough President Adams, who led students and other residents in an after-school rally at the Prospect Park Bandshell that followed many of the morning walkouts, urged Brooklynites to stay vigilant in their fight for lasting reform.

“Now is that moment. We must do something about guns,” he said. “This rally is just the beginning of a movement for national change on this critical issue.”

And Mayor DeBlasio returned to Kings County to

join the walkout at Edward R. Murrow, where he also spoke about the need to tighten gun regulations.

But despite Hizzoner’s involvement, kids who participated in the demonstration at the public high school were still marked absent from class, according to Alam, who said she would have appreciated a free pass from the leaders of the city’s education system.

“I would have done it either way, but I would prefer if I wasn’t marked absent,” she said.

Small miracle

Pregnant Slope-crash survivor's unborn baby will live, family says

A Tony Award-winning actress's unborn child will survive after a driver ran over the pregnant woman on March 5 in a harrowing Park Slope collision that claimed the life of her 4-year-old daughter and another 1-year-old boy.

The family of Broadway performer Ruthie Ann Miles on March 8 confirmed she did not lose her unborn baby in the deadly crash via a Twitter post that also thanked local well-wishers for their concern following the incident.

"Ruthie is now out of ICU and healing, by all accounts it is a miracle our second child is unharmed," the post read. "We are extremely grateful for your kindness and generosity."

Miles, 34, was crossing Ninth Street at Fifth Avenue with her daughter Abigail Blumenstein when Staten Island resident Dorothy Bruns drove through the crowded crosswalk, striking the pair along with Miles's friend Lauren Lew, her son Joshua, and another man at 12:40 pm. Both youngsters died before rescuers arrived, according to police, who said emergency responders rushed the adults to nearby Methodist Hospital in critical condition.

Following the fatal collision — for which officials did not immediately charge Bruns, claiming a

seizure may have led her to plow into the victims — do-gooders donated more than \$400,000 to an online fundraiser in support of Miles and her kin, far exceeding the \$5,000 goal set by the family friend who organized the initiative.

And big-hearted donors showed similar support for the Lew family, contributing more than \$210,000 to a separate online fund-raiser set up after the death of their boy.

Many well-wishers left heart-warming words of encouragement with their financial pledges, expressing condolences and hopes for a speedy recovery.

"I'm so sorry for your loss," said Gail Eve Malatesta, who donated to the fundraiser for the Miles family. "I wish I could give more, and I wish I could give you something more meaningful than money. My thoughts are with your family."

In 2015, Miles won the Tony Award for Best Featured Actress in a Musical for her performance as Lady Chiang in "The King and I."

Critics also recognized the Arizona-born, Hawaii-raised actress for her talent in other roles, including her portrayal of the shoe-obsessed wife of a former Filipino dictator, Imelda Marcos, in the 2013 off-Broadway production of "Here Lies Love."

Thorough examination

DA to comb medical history of motorist who killed two kids in Park Slope before pressing charges

Kings County's top prosecutor must probe the medical history of the woman who last Monday killed two children after she ran a red light and collided with them in Park Slope before he can charge her, he said.

District Attorney Eric Gonzalez indicated that a seizure may have led Staten Island resident Dorothy Bruns to plow her Volvo sedan into the kids and their mothers, who survived along with another struck man, and said he is examining the motorist's health records to determine whether her decision to get behind the wheel constitutes a criminal violation of the law.

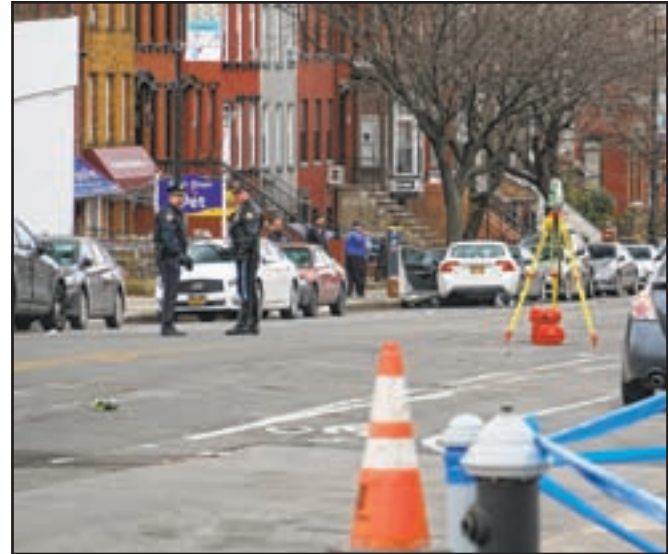
"It's a real tragedy, but we have to make sure this woman should have been driving in the first place," Gonzalez said.

Various reports citing anonymous law-enforcement sources indicate that Bruns, who fatally hit 1-year-old Joshua Lew and 4-year-old Abigail Blumenstein as they crossed Ninth Street at Fifth Avenue with the other victims, suffered from numerous medical conditions, including multiple sclerosis.

If true, the deadly crash mirrors a January 2017 incident in East Flatbush that left pedestrian and father Marlon Palacios dead after a driver diagnosed with multiple sclerosis plowed into him at high speeds on Linden Boulevard. Gonzalez charged that motorist with reckless manslaughter in February, after investigators alleged that his neurological disorder directly contributed to the crash — and that he ignored his doctor's orders not to get behind the wheel because of his condition.

And the district attorney's investigators can now be expected to comb Bruns's medical past to find out whether doctors issued her similar warnings before she drove into the victims, potentially issuing subpoenas to uncover documents that could be used against her, according to one personal-injury lawyer.

"They're going to be talking to doctors, subpoenaing

records, looking for documentation of that," said Daniel Flanzig, a Manhattan-based attorney who represents pedestrians and cyclists.

Prosecutors may also investigate whether Bruns suffered previous seizures or other debilitating episodes, and if she herself could have known that her physical health could affect her ability to drive, Flanzig said.

"If you know with some reasonable degree that your ability to operate a vehicle is compromised, it can still rise to that level of being reckless, even without a doctor," he said.

But if the alleged seizure that caused Bruns — whose driver's license was revoked by the Department of Motor Vehicles after last week's collision at the urging of police — to lose control of her vehicle in Park Slope is deemed an isolated incident, the district attorney may find it harder to build a case, according to Flanzig.

Gonzalez's decision not to immediately charge Bruns after the deadly crash followed his similar reactions in the wake of other fatal collisions in the borough.

Last month, he did not charge the United Parcel Ser-

vice trucker who hit and killed a 27-year-old woman crossing Ashland Place at DeKalb Avenue in Fort Greene, even though police said the victim had the right of way at the time of the incident.

In January, oil-truck driver Philip Monfoletto ran down 13-year-old cyclist Kevin Flores while behind the wheel of his big-rig in Bedford-Stuyvesant, killing the boy. Gonzalez slapped Monfoletto with a criminal-misdemeanor charge for operating the heavy-duty vehicle with a suspended license, but failed to bring felony charges against the trucker, whose license had been suspended nine times when the collision occurred — one suspension short of the 10 needed at the time of any arrest to warrant more serious consequences.

And last July, Action Carting garbage-truck driver Jose Nunez smashed into cyclist Neftaly Ramirez, killing him before driving away without alerting authorities. Separate investigations by the police and the district attorney, however, concluded that Nunez didn't know he ran over Ramirez, and the motorist walked away with a summons for driving the truck without the correct class of licence.

Higher learning, lower maintenance

Students blast Brooklyn College for janky campus

More like Brokelynn College!

Dozens of Brooklyn College students protested their campus's abysmal conditions along with roughly 100 pupils from other schools in the City University of New York's portfolio on Monday at a rare open meeting of the school system's board of trustees at the Flatbush campus.

"At Brooklyn College the infrastructure is crumbling," said Corrinne Greene, a junior studying theater. "I can't overemphasize that."

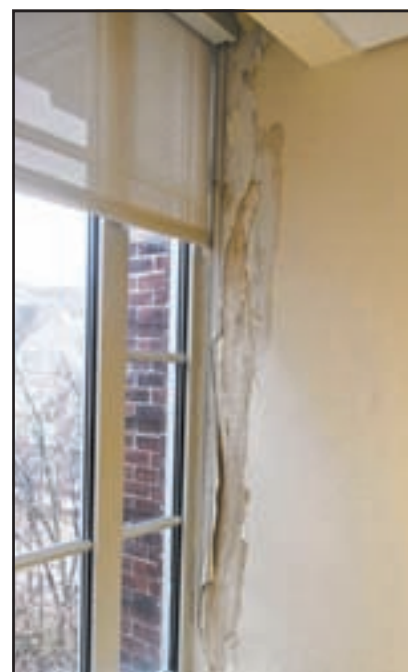
The students complained that they are sick of the missing ceiling tiles, broken bathrooms, and lack of adequate funding at Brooklyn College. Faculty agreed, slamming Gov. Cuomo's budget, saying it cut funds to the city, further squeezing the university system.

"We've suffered badly from the withdrawal of state funding," said Brooklyn College biology teacher Peter Lipke to the board at the hearing. "Our beautiful campus is crumbling."

The clock tower in the center of campus has come to symbolize the school's failing infrastructure.

"Our gorgeous clock tower," said Greene, "The symbol of our school, recently stopped functioning."

The students have started social-media campaigns to call attention to the dire conditions of the facilities, and the aptly named @cuny_brokelynn_col-

lege Instagram account has more than 200 followers. There's also a Facebook page called Fixing Brokelynn College.

The problems go beyond unabated asbestos, damaged walls, and out-of-order bathrooms, the students com-

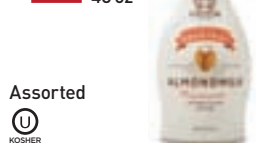

Phantom withdrawal

It's about Times!

Gray Lady's obit for woman behind Brooklyn Bridge comes more than 100 years after local paper's report

Get with the times!

The borough's one-time newspaper of record reported the death of Emily Warren Roebling — the woman who in the late 1800s took on the herculean task of completing the Brooklyn Bridge, then the world's first steel-cable suspension span, when she wasn't even allowed to vote — more than a century before the city's long-time paper of record published her obituary last week.

The New York Times, which began printing on the distant isle at the other end of Brooklyn's namesake crossing in 1851, published its better-late-than-never report as part of a series on pioneering women whose legacies the paper's then-predominately white male newsroom failed to recognize in their eras, including black investigative journalist Ida B. Wells, gay-rights activist and drag

performer Marsha P. Johnson, and mathematician Ada Lovelace.

But Roebling's death at 59 in 1903, more than 50 years after the Times debuted, failed to make its headlines at the

time despite her profound contribution to the city it had then called home for decades.

The Brooklyn Daily Eagle, however — which was published from 1841 to 1955 before coming back to life under entirely new owners in 1996 — reported news of Roebling's passing one day after she died in her New Jersey home.

Its obituary quoted her doctor at the time, who reportedly believed that her work on the bridge was too arduous for a lady to handle and attributed her death to fatigue — not the stomach cancer that actually killed her.

"The work done by Mrs. Roebling at this time was far too great for any woman and her health has never been the same since then," the newspaper reported on March 1, 1903. "Dr. Clark, the family physician, traces the mental and physical exhaustion, which culminated in the recent breakdown from the time

when Mrs. Roebling worked on Brooklyn Bridge."

Roebling's obituary in the Eagle — printed next to articles about typhoid victims and how some female teachers in Brooklyn opposed someone of their own sex leading the borough's school system — highlighted her fight for women's

equality, book smarts, and loyal friendships, but heralded her work on the bridge as her biggest feat.

"Of attractive personality, tactful, gracious and winning in manner, she was a prominent figure in social and club life — a ready speaker, a

all the key players in the precinct are the best people to be in those spots.

AL: What are some of the goals you had in mind when you came back here to the 60th?

JH: I'm hoping to continue Inspector Taylor's good tenure here reducing crime. He had a good deployment strategy of having fixed posts — foot posts in areas of high crime that showed a police presence, especially during the summertime.

AL: Is there anything you think you bring to the table that's unique?

JH: I feel that in the 68th we had a good deployment versus narcotics, especially opioid addiction and heroin addiction. The 60th is part of the CLEAR program that the 68th is a part of, where first-time offenders and low drug offenders for controlled substances, that's gonna call them a counselor to try and talk to them and get them affiliated with a rehab facility so that they can get help instead of punishment in jail. I think the 68th had a very successful strategy towards combatting drug use and narcotics use, which led to petty crime. I feel if we get a hold on that, it stops the petty crime in the neighborhoods such as car break-ins and stuff like that.

AL: What direction would you say crime is trending in the 60th?

JH: We're not really getting a spike

in violent crimes. Seems like we're having crimes towards grand larcenies and petty larcenies, of people leaving valuables in cars and cars getting broken into, which I feel we could help. We gotta get the message out there and educate people not to leave their stuff in cars.

AL: The last thing I wanted to ask was about the trial of the two detectives who allegedly raped a woman in their custody in this area. Did that have any effect on morale here?

JH: Nah, I don't really know too much about that. They weren't 60th Precinct cops, they were from outside.

AL: Do you think the 60th has been unfairly lumped in with them because they weren't 60th Precinct officers?

JH: Nah. You're the first person to bring that up. Nobody's really brought that up since I got here.

AL: Do you think that's a problem that's pervasive in the police force, having sex with people in custody?

JH: Nah. I think the punishment would be very severe if anybody was to do that.

AL: Why have you stayed a career police officer as opposed to moving on to something else?

JH: I love this job. I think anybody who takes the test to become a police officer, you're really looking to get a job where you can help people. And what better way than day after day to go to a job where people call for help and you can actually go to their houses, or their places of employment, and actually help them? — **Adam Lucente**

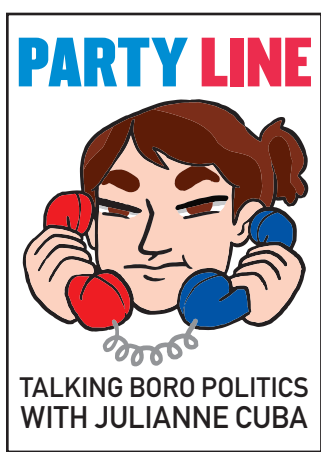
Musical chairs with Harris seat

The drama continues. Rumors are still gaining steam that state Sen. **Marty Golden's** (R-Bay Ridge) challenger, **Andrew Gounardes**, might run for what would become a vacant seat if disgraced Assemblywoman **Pamela Harris** (D-Coney Island) steps down from her post, despite him repeatedly denying that he plans to switch ballots.

"Andrew's considering — that's a fact," said Gounardes's Democratic competitor to replace Golden, Bay Ridge journalist **Ross Barkan**.

It would be harder for Gounardes to oust Golden, the incumbent since 2003 — whom he also ran against and lost to in 2012 — than it would be for him to fill Harris's shoes.

But other rumors suggest Gounardes is being persuaded to stay in his fight to unseat Golden because his fellow Bay Ridge Democrats club member and newly elected Councilman **Justin Brannan** (D-Bay Ridge) wants to reserve Harris's seat for his chief of staff **Chris McCreight**, who once ran for the district's unpaid



position of District Leader against Councilman **Mark Treyger** (D-Coney Island).

There may be wrangling behind closed doors between two rival political clubs — Treyger's United Progressive Democratic Club and Brannan's Bay Ridge Democrats.

It makes sense McCreight is eyeing the seat, and the two clubs have a history of animosity that dates back years, said Barkan.

"It's their district, they have a say. It's a lot of internal dynamics. They've been at odds in the past," he said. "Chris has

been a candidate for district leader, it would make sense he's interested in this too."

Gounardes is still putting the kibosh on the rumors and insists that no one is trying to change his mind.

"Nothing has changed in my plans whatsoever — still 100-percent focused on running for the state Senate," he said. "No one has asked me to now switch a race, I've been very clear to everyone."

... It's dueling polls and pols. A convicted felon running again to take back his old seat from Rep. **Dan Donovan** (R-Bay Ridge) put out a poll that shows him in the lead of the race — but the incumbent is calling his bluff and claims it's just a big joke.

The one-time Rock-to-Ridge representative's poll, conducted by consulting firm Big Dog Strategies, shows that 35.2 percent of voters questioned by phone in early March would cast their ballots for him in the June Republican primary, while just 34.1 percent would for Donovan.

The disgraced congress-

man — who served seven months in prison for tax fraud — is still a hero among some Brooklynites, who started calling on him to run again in 2016 just weeks after his release from jail.

The former Marine, federal investigator, and tax-dodger has been campaigning under the same slogan as President Trump, but Donovan criticized him for his more left-leaning voting record and affiliation with former President Obama.

"Grimm's poll is as laughable as his attempts to bury his liberal voting record as one of the most reliable votes for Obama," said Donovan's spokeswoman **Jessica Proud**. "He is an established liar and cheat, and this desperate poll full of absurdities shows he hasn't changed one bit."

Donovan's own poll, conducted by marketing research consultant and pollster Barry Zepelwitz and Associates, shows the incumbent handily taking the lead, with 60 percent of locals saying they would vote for him, and just 21 percent saying they would for

his challenger.

... They may be coming back to Brooklyn.

New York City's First Lady **Chirlane McCray** is considering throwing her hat in the ring to run for office after her husband finishes his second mayoral term — and that could take her and Hizzoner back to Brooklyn.

Before she and **Mayor DeBlasio** moved from Park Slope into Gracie Mansion, DeBlasio had been the neighborhood's councilman and the political power couple lived there through his time as public advocate.

McCray hasn't said what she'd run for, just that she's eyeing the possibility in 2021.

"Although I am not actively planning to run for office right now, I do not rule out the possibility of running in the future," said the First Lady. "As a staunch advocate for better representation in our elected officials, I encourage women to run for office all the time. And how can I encourage others if I don't seriously consider running myself?"

plained, extending to inadequate funding of the school's programs. The music major who runs the Facebook page complained that many of his professors are adjuncts only working part time, making it difficult to get help learning new pieces of music, for example.

"I pay money to go this university, and they don't have full-time staff. I can't ask one of my teachers for help," said Allan Randall.

Construction of a new performing-arts center has been pushed back many times over the past few years, according to Randall and Greene.

And students aren't the only ones lamenting conditions at the school. Brooklyn College itself admits the facilities are in need of a makeover.

"Most of the buildings at Brooklyn College are more than 50 years old, and are challenged by decades of deferred maintenance," said a spokesman for the school.

The rep added that the school is working with the city and the state to

make upgrades.

Greene said she believes the demonstration by students from across the city university system will make an impression on the board of trustees.

"I hope it's a symbol to the board of trustees and shows we are mobilized together," said Greene. "This has gone on way too long."

Marching to keep seniors well-fed and safe

Bay Ridge Center and Meals on Wheels join forces for annual March for Meals

BAY RIDGE CENTER

They're making sure Bay Ridge's seniors are not forgotten.

The Bay Ridge Center and Meals on Wheels will hold its 23rd annual March for Meals event in the neighborhood on March 24.

Todd W. Fliedner, deputy executive director of the center, says the need for the home deliveries continues to grow.

"About five years ago, we were delivering 400 meals a day. We now deliver 650," he said.

But the demand is even greater because the population is aging.

Bay Ridge, he says, is a "naturally occurring retirement community." These are people who have lived in the same place their entire lives. As a result, the neighborhood has the third largest population of seniors in all of Brooklyn, he says.

That's why the Bay Ridge Center added a new delivery route in December. Currently, it has six vehicles that deliver

meals, and each one needs a driver and a helper. It is the helper who goes into people's homes to personally deliver the meals. As many of the elderly are housebound, "Sometimes, that helper is the only person the resident sees all day." In a sense, these helpers not only bring meals, but also make informal safety checks to be sure the homebound are okay.

He notes a recent study of Meals on Wheels participants — conducted by Brown University's Center for Gerontology and Healthcare Research, and funded by AARP — which demonstrated that participation in the traditional Meals on Wheels program has a positive impact on the health, well-being, and social connectedness of homebound seniors. Key findings from the study were that seniors receiving daily meals exhibited improvements in their mental health, were less lonely, and felt less isolated. They felt more confident about living independently in their own homes.

They ate healthier foods, and experienced reduced rates of hospitalization and falls when compared to seniors who did not receive the service.

Baby boomers continue to age — a population increasing at the fastest rate in history — and will increase by 50 percent in the next 15 years, he says.

The Bay Ridge Center provides services and programs

for adults 60 years and older in southwest Brooklyn. These programs promote well-being, support independence, and encourage their involvement in community life. Since 1976, the staff has been aided by enthusiastic volunteers.

Together, they work with community organizations, local businesses, schools, and social service organizations to

enrich the lives of seniors.

With more than 1,000 active members, the Bay Ridge Center is the largest and most active program serving seniors in southwest Brooklyn.

The walk will follow a 1.9-mile course starting at the center's address at Fourth and Ovington avenues to Third Avenue, from Third Avenue to 83rd Street, onto 83rd Street to Fifth Avenue, and then from Fifth Avenue back to Ovington Avenue.

Registration begins at 10 am, with kick-off ceremonies starting at 10:30 am, and the march officially starting at 11 am. Prizes will be awarded at 12:30 pm. All funds raised go to the Bay Ridge Center's Meals on Wheels program and other services that support neighborhood seniors.

Help from a higher power

Feds: EPA can spare century-old building

BY JULIANNE CUBA

This Protection Agency is doing double duty!

Federal officials overseeing the ongoing cleanup of the Gowanus Canal could save the so-called historic Gowanus Station building from the wrecking ball as city leaders seek to raze the structure in order to install a subterranean sewage tank on the land it occupies, according to the man spearheading the scrub.

"Because it's a Superfund site, if an underground tank is built at the location where the building stands, then that location becomes part of site," said the Environmental Protec-

tion Agency's project manager Christos Tsiamis. "And the EPA's jurisdiction includes the fate of building."

Last November, the city kicked-off its lengthy Uniform Land Use Review Procedure in an attempt to seize the privately owned Butler Street property and an adjacent Nevins Street parcel through eminent domain to make way for two underground vessels that would hold a combined 12-million gallons of raw waste and storm water so neither spills into the canal during rain storms.

The Landmarks Preservation Commission in December decided

not to move forward with a request to protect the Gowanus Station building because its members claimed the brick Beaux Arts structure lacked architectural merit after undergoing several alterations since it was built in 1913.

The agency instead gave the city's Department of Environmental Protection the go-ahead to demolish the building that once supplied the city with water, and a spokesman for that department said it plans to bulldoze most of it and save only a few decorative elements, pending the outcome of the eminent-domain application.

"If DEP does acquire the property, we will look to save the Gowanus Station plaque as well as other ornamental features and incorporate them, where feasible, into the EPA-mandated retention-tank facilities," said Edward Timbers.

But the ultimate power to preserve any historically significant building within the Superfund site lies with the Feds as the overseer of the cleanse, and Environmental Protection Agency bigwigs will consult with their own archeologist to make a final call regarding Gowanus Station's fate, according to Tsiamis.

And the decision may differ or confer with the city's, according to the cleanup manager, who explained the process alongside reps from the

state's Historic Preservation Office, the Environmental Protection Department, and the Landmarks Commission at a Feb. 27 meeting of local watchdog organization the Gowanus Canal Community Advisory Group.

"There's an archaeological component as part of the Superfund process, and so that is why the EPA is involved — it has an archaeologist who,

in consultation with those agencies, makes his assessments as to how to proceed and eventually we, EPA, have to make a decision based on that input, and the public's, of course," Tsiamis said. "We are taking into account the public's wishes and the engineers' challenges, and trying to come up with something that makes sense."

The federal agency will make its

decision on whether to save the building in the next few months, Tsiamis said, once it receives recommendations from its archeologist and city and state officials, who all will weigh in on how pricey and challenging it may be for engineers to preserve the entire structure.

"I will have to make a decision, then pass it onto the city," he said. "I made it very clear that, from an engineering point of view, it would be very expensive to try to save the building and put the retention tank in same parcel of land."

If the city doesn't acquire the private land on Nevins and Butler streets by 2020, the Feds will move forward with installing the sewage tanks where cleanup leaders originally proposed they go: in the grave of the nabe's beloved Double D pool, which must be exhumed in order to purge toxins buried beneath the play space, but will be rebuilt at its longtime site if the city's eminent-domain proposal passes.

And in other news on the canal, the slow-going cleanup that began in 2016 is inching along, according to Tsiamis, who said engineers are still installing bulkheads along the fetid waterway in order to resume a pilot dredging-and-capping program in March that was originally supposed to wrap this April, but was delayed when workers' too-powerful equipment started creating fissures in nearby land and buildings shortly after the job kicked-off last October.

bright, witty conversationalist, and a woman whose intellectual gifts were undeniable,” the Eagle reported. “In spite of her prominence among the women of the country in all movements which looked toward the so-called emancipation of the sex, Mrs. Roebling’s chief claim to fame lies in the park which she took in superintending the building of Brooklyn Bridge.”

The Times piece published on March 8, 2018 similarly touted Roebling’s achievements at a time when women were often overshadowed by men, sourcing some of its material from biographies written about her husband, who became bedridden inside the couple’s Brooklyn Heights apartment after contracting Cassions Disease, or the bends, while working on the crossing.

Roebling then assumed her role overseeing the project, keeping her ailing husband up to date with daily morning progress reports before taking off for the site of the in-the-works bridge — where more than 20 men died during its construction — to chat with journalists, politicians, and engineers as she shepherded the massive

piece of infrastructure to completion.

And in 1883, with work on the Brooklyn Bridge finally finished, Roebling was the first to cross it — allegedly riding inside a horse-drawn carriage with a rooster, symbolic of victory, in her lap — about 16 years before she graduated from New York University in 1899.

Roebling, who passed away at the couple’s home in distant New Jersey, always preferred living in the County of Kings, which she considered her home until her dying day, according to the Eagle.

“Although circumstances compelled her to reside elsewhere she made no secret of her liking for Brooklyn and announced in public that she looked upon it has her home,” the paper reported. “She was a frequent visitor here and numbered many warm, true friends among the residents of this borough, to whose interests she was ever loyal.”

Last year, members of Brooklyn Heights’ Community Board 2 recognized Roebling’s contribution to and passion for her former home by voting to co-name a street near where she and her husband once lived “Emily Warren Roebling Way.”

Pol: Courier got it wrong on school scanners

To the editor,

The article "Not cool for school: Ridgites reject Golden's plan to put body scanners in schools" is factually incorrect. In a rush to go to print, the reporter failed to gather accurate information for this prejudicial story. The technology described in the article is *not* what I am advocating to use in our schools. The next generation scanning technology I am proposing is leaps and bounds ahead of outmoded metal detectors, which are slow, bulky, intrusive and inconvenient. Your article is correct, however, in the fact that the technology detailed would definitely be wrong for our schools. We need to protect our students without making them feel as if they are passing through a TSA checkpoint on their way to class. This technology accomplishes just that and does not generate a body image as falsely indicated in the article.

This quick capacity smart sensor threat detection system I propose is recognized as the least intrusive object detection system on the market. The scanners are thoroughly vetted and approved for scanning individuals of all ages. To ensure safety, the state of the art scanners utilize pulse induction and magnetometers, and does *not* employ dangerous X-ray technology. It is so harmless, individuals with pacemakers or pregnant women can pass through without worry.

Industry insiders state that the system incorporates technology unlike the detectors used by the TSA. The proposed threat detection system uses two sensors: the first sensor, the magnetometer, is 100 percent passive and has zero emission of any signal used today. The second sensor, the induction balance sensor, has a Very Low Frequency (VLF) signal that is pulsed 12kHz, but only 10 percent of the time. The effective emission is 0.017 uW/cm2 maximum. The limit set by FCC to be "continuous exposure" with no harm is 200 uW/cm2. This system is 11,000 times under that limit. The emission is radio waves not X-ray, millimeter (mmWave) nor microwave. As previously stated, the system *does not* expose any harmful radiation of any type to users or those being screened. The technology is 100

percent unobtrusive and non-invasive. No imaging occurs that is neither revealing, has cultural sensitivities, nor negative implications. The photos taken is only to show the overlay of the detections that the sensors locate. The bottom line is the technology is safe, effective and considerate of the individual.

Additionally, corporations with strict human resource regulations have chosen this technology because it does not infringe on employees' rights or privacy. It is unfortunate that your reporter decided to spread misinformation to incite fear in parents. This scanning system will quickly and accurately identify a student attempting to bring a dangerous weapon into school. The scanners have the ability to detect objects with iron, nickel, cobalt, copper and more.

These systems are inconspicuous, and have the ability to detect high-risk items in addition to firearms, such as knives, brass knuckles and improvised weapons. Sadly, our schools have become soft targets and current security protocols are not sufficient to protect our students. Incorporating this technology in our schools, along with a police officer, will give parents peace of mind and needed security for students. It is important that we utilize every possible safety measure to protect our teachers and students.

When you compare these advanced scanners with old-style metal detectors, the difference is like night and day. The inaccuracy of your article demands nothing less than a retraction. I am dismayed by this faulty journalism and biased reporting, but I will not let it deter me from pursuing all means necessary to protect our schools and our students.

Missing Dem Bums

To the editor,

The passing of former Brooklyn Dodger great Duke Snider on Feb. 27, 2011 seven years ago marked the end of the "Boys of Summer." He was the last living regular day to day player who made up many of the 1950's Dodgers winning teams. They included catcher Roy Campanella, first baseman Gil Hodges, second baseman Junior Gilliam, shortstop Pee Wee Reese, third baseman Billy Cox, right fielder Carl Furillo, and Jackie Robinson, who played several positions. Most have long forgotten that today's Los Angeles Dodgers had their roots in Brooklyn, New York.

The original Brooklyn Dodgers name was derived from Brooklyn residents who would dodge the hundreds of trolley cars which ran on dozens of routes for decades until their own decline and final death in the 1950s. The golden era of baseball in NYC took place in the '50s, with a three-way ri-

valry between the American League Bronx Yankees, National League New York Giants, and Brooklyn Dodgers. All three teams claimed to have the best center fielder in baseball. On street corners all over town, citizens would argue whether the Yankees' Mickey Mantle, Giants' Willie Mays, or Dodgers' Duke Snider was champ. Ordinary Brooklyn natives could ride the bus, trolley, or subway to Ebbets Field to see their beloved Dodgers. Working and middle class men and woman of all ages, classes, and races commingled in the stands. Everyone could afford a bleacher, general admission, reserve, or box seat. Hot dogs, beer, other refreshments and souvenirs were reasonably priced. Team owners would raise or reduce a player's salary based on their performance the past season. Salaries were so low that virtually all Dodger players worked at another job off-season. Most Dodger players were actually neighbors who lived and worked in various communities in the County of Kings.

Television was a relatively new technology and the local movie theater was still king for entertainment. The Dodgers' departure from Brooklyn coincided with many residents also moving out of town.

This year marks the 61st anniversary of the old Brooklyn Dodgers playing their final season in Brooklyn.

During the 1950s, Brooklyn Dodgers owner Walter O'Malley tried to find various locations for construction of a new baseball stadium, which he pledged to finance using his own funds. With limited seating and automobile parking capacity at Ebbets Field, he needed a new modern stadium to remain financially viable.

New York City master megabuilder Robert Moses refused to allow him access to the current day Atlantic Yards project site. This location was easily accessible to thousands of baseball fans from all around the Big Apple via numerous subway lines.

Thousands of fans who moved to eastern Queens, Nassau and Suffolk County would have had direct access via the Long Island Rail Road. Imagine how different Brooklyn would have been if elected officials had stood up to Robert Moses and allowed construction of a new Dodgers stadium in downtown Brooklyn. The 1950's Boys of Summer might have played on with new players entertaining new generations for decades more.

Oakland's sanctuary city mayor should be arrested

On Saturday, Feb. 24, Oakland Mayor Libby Schaaf broke the law when he warned criminals on Twitter that U.S. Immigration and Custom Enforcement was going to start rounding up illegal aliens in the Bay Area "in the next 24 hours."

So Mayor Schaaf should be arrested.

According to the feds, this operation aimed to arrest those here illegally that were "public safety threats," and of the 232 arrested, crimes committed included murder, drug trafficking, aggravated assault, lewd acts with a minor, and battery, according to reports

Armando Nunez-Sagado, a Mexican gang member, was one. He had convictions for burglary and assault with a deadly weapon — among other crimes — and had been deported four times.

But because of Mayor Schaaf's heads up, it is estimated that 800 others were not captured, according to reports.

What communities they

will end up in and what crimes they will go on to commit against American citizens is anybody's guess.

According to U.S. Code Title 18, Chapter 73, Section 1505, if someone "influences, obstructs, or impedes or endeavors to influence obstruct, or impede the due and proper administration

of the law under which any pending proceedings is being had before any department or agency of the United States," they have committed obstruction of justice.

The case can certainly be made that Mayor Schiff impeded the Immigration's efforts. The mayor could also be charged with violating Title 8, Chapter 12 of the U.S. Code relating to "Bringing in and Harboring Certain Aliens." Section 1324 makes it a crime to "shield from detection" anyone who "has come to, entered, or remains in the United States in violation of the law."

And violators should be prosecuted.

"What she did is no better than a gang lookout yelling 'police' when a police cruiser comes by in the neighborhood," acting director Tom Homan said. "This is beyond the pale."

The extremes of both political parties have divided our country over immigration long enough. Most Americans agree we should not deport immigrants that

work hard, pay their taxes, and have no criminal record.

But, if it's an immigrant is a robber, thief, rapist or murderer, they should be sent packing.

Our national, state, and city leaders should listen to this common-sense approach. The extremism of Mayor Schaaf should be rejected, and if it means she must get arrested to send this message, so be it.

California has recently passed "sanctuary state" laws regarding immigration enforcement that will likely make its way to the Supreme Court because U.S. Attorney General Jeff Sessions has filed a federal lawsuit to block them. One of these laws requires private employers to warn workers of immigration operations at their facilities — thus requiring state residents to follow Mayor Schiff's shameful example.

I have spent many semesters instructing students about federalism and our Constitution. One key provi-

sion is the Supremacy clause, which states that the Constitution and federal laws made pursuant to it, are the supreme law of the land. This includes immigration laws and their enforcement.

When Arizona attempted to be tougher on illegal immigration than the federal government, the Obama administration objected and filed a lawsuit. The Supreme Court ruled parts of the state's legislation as unconstitutional in *Arizona v. United States* (2012) because it usurped the federal government's authority relating to immigration laws and enforcement.

Now, California has flipped the script in the other direction, but I suspect the judicial decision will be the same and the supremacy of the federal government over immigration enforcement will stand.

Chow down on Buffalo foods at Brooklyn festival

Buffalo fans, won't you come out tonight?

Brooklynites can get a belly-full of the cuisine and culture of New York's second largest city at the "Buffalo City Fair," at the Bell House in Gowanus on March 24. The six-hour wild wing-ding distills a weekend trip to the city nearest Niagra Falls into a delicious afternoon, for those who are home-sick for Buffalo or those who want to explore a new town, said the event's director.

"This is a good snapshot of that weekend," said Varghese Chacko, who lives in Park Slope. "Our plan is to give both people who live in New York City or who are from Buffalo a sense of that food and culture."

First on the menu is Buffalo's most famous food — buffalo wings! The

saucy, spicy chicken wings are a familiar sight to down-state New Yorkers, but some of the other dishes may be new, including "garbage plates," a multi-option tray often including a cheeseburger, french fries, pasta salad, beans, and coleslaw — "beef on weck," a roast beef on a roll — and loganberry drinks, a soda made with hybrid raspberry and blackberry flavors, which the Fair will serve spiked with booze.

Heading up the production of the Buffalonian buffet is chef John Marren, who owns the restaurant Buffalo's Famous in Kensington. The 10-year transplant from that city says that he is no purist — his hometown's food can be served anywhere, as long as the chef has a strong appreciation for its origin.

"It doesn't need to be made in Buffalo, but it needs to be made in the same tra-

dition as Buffalo," said Marren. "Some purists won't look at a barbecue pizza as pizza, but I don't look at it that hardcore. I just feel you just have to have a healthy respect for how it's made, and give a s---."

Marren said he is thrilled at being able to relive some nostalgia and give people the experience of eating the food he grew up with.

"I'm most excited to have a lot of authenticity under one roof — that's what we're aiming for, and we're trying to make sure it's authentic," he said. "In the last decade, everyone agreed that Buffalo has a top 10 food culture — if you're a foodie this is an opportunity to check out a reputable food culture."

Several bands and comedians from Buffalo will perform during the festival, and visitors can play "kan jam," a beloved

Buffalo frisbee game.

Chacko's organization, City Fair, has previously celebrated Colorado food, and next plans to highlight dishes from Cleveland, Ohio. But for this session, he decided to go closer to home, and to help Brooklynites appreciate the food culture on the far side of the state.

"I think it's just a great way to get a sense of the food and entertainment and really, the people of Buffalo," said Chacko. "Buffalo has passionate residents, and the mixture of food and comedy and entertainment and attendees — it's going to bring a great mix of Buffalo flavor to new people."

Irish rock band Waysties returns home

It's the ultimate bar band!

On St. Patrick's Day, a whiskey-soaked Irish rock band will belt out tunes from the Emerald Isle and Celticized '80s hits from the stage of the Way Station bar in Prospect Heights. But the band is not just here for the holiday — the Waysties is the official house band of the Dr. Who-themed watering hole, and its members met while bellied up to its bar. The bar's owner said that he saw a potential hit in bringing together some of his Irish music-loving regulars.

"They were sitting at the bar lamenting that they couldn't find people to play with. I said 'Great, I want you to form a band,'" said Andy Heidel. "I had a band sitting in front of me that didn't know they were a band yet."

The members quibble about the details, but all agree they were Way Station regulars who played their first show there on St. Patrick's Day in 2012, at Heidel's request. The band has played regularly there ever since, and will play with other Irish acts on March 17.

The band's regular appearances have created a strong bond with the audience, according to the Waystie who sings and plays guitar, banjo and Irish bouzouki.

"When you play regular sets for the same community of people, it develops a really strong culture of regulars," said Robare Pruyn. "It has the quality of a family."

The Waysties are united by their love for the Way Station and by their passion for Irish music. Member Sarah Storm, who lives in Ditmas Park, said that the full-blooded subject matter of

Erin's tunes drew her in.

"There are songs about drinking and fighting and death. They're really good stories with beautiful music," said the singer, guitarist and bodhran player — a type of Irish drum.

The Way Station may be more intergalactic than it is Irish, but the Celtic tunes go well with its atmosphere, according to the band's mandolin player.

"There's a really good crowd of regulars, and the Way Station has a bit of an old-timey vibe," said Noam Berg. "This suits Irish music."

In addition to traditional ballads, the Waysties also blend Irish music with pop hits. Its rendition of "Safety Dance"

by Men Without Hats, with the famous riff played on mandolin, goes over particularly well, said Berg.

In the years since the band formed, most of its members have moved to Philadelphia, but their connection to the Way Station and its nerd-friendly crowd has kept them all coming back.

"Most of us are giant nerds," said Pruyn. "The bar is the type of place that attracts people we get along with by default."

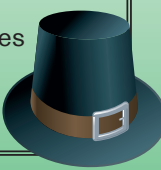

PLAGUE ON PAINT

Exhibit celebrates artists affected by AIDS

He is giving their art new life. A new exhibit will showcase a dozen under-recognized artists who were affected by the devastating HIV and AIDS epidemic of the 1980s, and the subsequent collapse of the East Village art scene. "Painting to Survive (1985-1995)," opening on March 18 at the Brooklyn Waterfront Artists Coalition in Red Hook, brings their important work back to the spotlight, said the show's curator.

"I think they are spectacular great paintings, and all should be better known," said art historian and artist Jonathan Weinberg, who lives in Connecticut. "These are artists whose work has been ignored because it sold out of fashion — this phenomenon of amazing painting going on and then suddenly it all shut down."

Two of the artists — Marc Lida and Richard Hofmann — died from the disease, but each artist in the show has a personal connection to it, he said.

"All the artists in the show have been very deeply touched by the AIDS epidemic, all have friends who died from it or also have friends who are still living with the disease," said Weinberg, who contributed his own portrait of Lida to the show.

The artists, who mostly worked in expressionist and figurative paintings at the time, used their art to express their feelings about the deaths that surrounded them, and to challenge the indifference of the government towards the disease, said Weinberg.

"The '80s was a tumultuous time, with Ronald Reagan and then George Bush. Reagan didn't mention the word 'AIDS' until his last months," he said. "It's as if there was a war was going on, and painting was a way for us to cope."

The epidemic cost the world a generation of art, said Weinberg.

"The work they might have made, we also lost the people who were part of the audience, might have lost their critique and advice and richness of their lives," he said. "Marc and Richard should be alive right

now, and they probably would have been if the government had been more responsive."

Dreaming in Dumbo

High-flying high concept for a 'Midsummer' show

What the Puck? A new dance theater piece will present an aerial and allegorical take on Shakespeare's "A Midsummer Night's Dream," with flying fairy figures representing the nations of the North American Free Trade Agreement. "The Dream Project," opening at the Gelsey Kirkland Arts Center in Dumbo on March 23, will feature trilingual actors exploring the relationships between the United States, Mexico, and Canada, in a story inspired by President Trump's hardline stance against immigrants, said the show's director.

"We're digging into the darkness of what's happening between our three countries, and what happens when we don't get along?" said Katie McHugh, who has worked across North America. "Trump is making all of these decisions that are putting our borders at risk."

The show focuses on the play's warring magical couple, the fairy rulers Oberon and Titania, who in this version represent the battling forces of capitalism and Mother Nature, respectively, as well as Canada and America, with Oberon's servant Puck standing in for Mexico. During the fight between king and queen, Titania wreaks havoc on

the fairy kingdom, a move meant to remind audience members of the effect of industry on the natural world, said McHugh.

"If Oberon's goal is to build at whatever cost, and Titania is Mother Nature — if they're at a conflict, what happens?" she asked. "In my mind, nature has the power to destroy all, and if we upset nature, then we're done. We are using Shakespeare's text and the conflict he created, but we're putting our own larger context on top of that."

The cast members will deliver their lines in English, French, and Spanish, but McHugh promised that the physical storytelling — including aerial choreography — will help all audience members understand the piece — even if it does not give any easy answers.

"I think the conversations that we're beginning in this piece through the medium of Shakespeare will hopefully spark conversations for people to talk about their political and social fears and what is actually happening with our borders," she said. "I want this piece to be a catalyst for conversation."

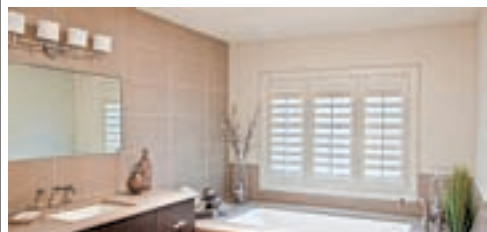

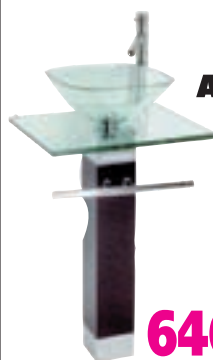
