FIFTY-WON!

Upstart wins primary by handful of votes



It's officially an upset.

Outsider candidate Mathylde Frontus beat out establishment-backed Ethan Lustig-Elgrably for the Democratic nomination for the 46th Assembly district — which includes Coney Island and Sea Gate as well as parts of Bath Beach, Bay Ridge, and Dyker Heights — by a mere 51 votes, according to certified results released today by the State Board of Elections.

The newly crowned nominee told this paper she was glad to get official confirmation of her win in the Sept. 13

Locals blast plan to oust residents for Coney project

Coney Islanders slammed plans for a Surf Avenue development that would displace residents of at least 28 apartments.

One local slammed the attorney representing the developer at Community Board 13's meeting on Sept. 26, asking him where the relocated residents would go and implying that they would be forced out of their homes for the new development.

"What are you going to do, sweep them under the rug and forget them?" board member Wanda Feliciano asked attorney Richard Lobel. "You're going to discard them and throw them somewhere so that your family or whatever can build?"

Lobel and Thomas Lang, an architect at Bricolage Designs, presented plans for the Winiarski Entities development, which includes

'Sweet Sally Sunshine'

Parachute Jump light-up honors 6-year-old slain by cancer

They went gold for their girl. Hundreds of Brooklynites gathered at Coney Island's Parachute Jump on Sept. 27 to watch it light up in gold for September's Childhood Cancer Awareness Month and to hold a candlelight vigil for late 6-year-old Ridgite Sally Kabel, who lost her battle with leukemia on Sept. 19.

Sally's father, Matt Kabel, said the September Parachute Jump lighting was always one of his little girl's favorites, and that the vigil brought the community together to rally around the youngster and her legacy.

"We all needed something to celebrate Sally," Kabel said. "Everybody came together for her."

Attendees came from near and far, many of whom had not yet met the family in person but had followed their years-long struggle to help Sally beat cancer, which parents Matt and Nicole chronicled on a blog, Facebook, and Instagram. Kabel said the size of the crowd surprised even him and his wife, adding that they did not expect to see acquaintances, friends, and family members who had made long treks for the vigil.

"I had coworkers there, friends we haven't seen in a long time — people drove in. It was overwhelming when we drove up and saw it," he said.

The dad thanked everyone for coming, emphasizing the importance of raising more funds and awareness for research into childhood cancers. And there were few dry eyes in the crowd when everyone joined in a sing-a-long of "You Are My Sunshine" — one of Sally's favorite songs.

One local who attended the vigil said she followed the family's trials on social media for years and felt she had to attend to express her condolences and the closeness she

"It was a good healing opportunity for the whole community," said Camille Loccisano, who lost her son, Frankie, to leukemia and bone cancer in 2007 and subsequently founded Frankie's Mission, an organization that helps families of children battling cancer. "She was a very inspirational little girl."

Councilman Mark Treyger (D-Coney Island) — who helped the Kabels coordinate the event — also delivered remarks in memory of the little girl, as did Councilman Justin Brannan (D-Bay Ridge) and state Sen. Marty Golden (R-Bay Ridge).

Kabel said he and his wife were glad that the event brought out bipartisan support, adding that locals' strong support for their daughter offered a nice change from the sometimes-divisive local political scene.

"Everybody came together for her — we got to know so many people in the neighborhood through Sally and saw the good in everybody," he said. "When we lost Sally, everybody came together again, and it was the first time we'd seen that in years."

felt to their girl.

"After she passed away, we felt like a part of it," said Bensonhurst resident Toni Franco. "I just felt like I needed to be there."

Later, towards the end of the event, the Kabels asked the crowd to line up so they could give all of them a hug to thank them for their support.

Franco said it was moving

to finally meet the family she had felt such a connection to for so many years.

"I got to finally meet them and hug them, and it was a beautiful experience," she said.

Another local who attended — and also lost a child to cancer — said it offered a chance for community members to connect and share their grief over the girl's passing.

Police arrest upstate fugitive in Park Slope

Police have apprehended a man who was wanted for the attempted murder of several police officers upstate and an armed robbery in Bay Ridge.

Joshua Stuart was apprehended at 5:33 pm in the vicinity of the 78th Precinct without incident, according to a spokesman for the police department.

State and city police were hunting the man who allegedly shot at police officers in Ellenville, NY, in the early hours of Sept. 28 and was caught on security video allegedly committing a gunpoint robbery of a Bay Ridge

bodega on Monday morning.

Stuart allegedly entered the store at Third Avenue and 84th Street at 8:37 am and demanded an employee's wallet at gunpoint, making off with \$50 and a credit card, according to police.

After Stuart was taken into custody, the U.S. Attorney for the Eastern District of New York announced that the bodega robbery would be prosecuted as a federal case under the Hobbs Act, which "prohibits actual or attempted robbery or extortion affecting interstate or foreign commerce in any way or degree."

Cops: East Midwood man threw 4-year-old brother off roof

A man has been charged with second degree murder for allegedly throwing his 4-year-old brother off the roof of an East Midwood apartment block on Sept. 29.

Shimron Smith was killed on Sept. 28 when his 20-year-old brother allegedly threw him off the top of the six-story building on Nostrand Avenue between Avenues J and K in the early hours of Friday morning, cops said.

Police responded to a 911

call at 3:31 am and found the child unconscious and unresponsive in the courtyard of the building and emergency medical services pronounced him dead at the scene.

The older brother was taken into custody about 12 hours later that day and charged with the murder of the young boy, according to police.

The defendant has a history of mental health issues, according to a police spokeswoman.

New B82 Select Bus Service launches

Southern Brooklyn may have a faster way across town.

The Metropolitan Transportation Authority and the city's Department of Transportation launched their new B82 Select Bus Service on Oct. 1, replacing the B82 Limited buses.

The decision to upgrade the B82 to the select service comes as a result of three years of community outreach, according to the transit authority, and was based on the route's high ridership, its course through dense residential neighborhoods and commercial centers, and its links to subway lines.

The new service promises shorter travel times for thousands of riders every day, said the city's Transportation Commissioner.

"For the last three years, our agencies have conducted extensive outreach with the community and stakeholders, and we believe that SBS will bring shorter travel times and more reliable service for 28,000 daily riders along one of Brooklyn's busiest bus routes from Starrett City to Coney Is-

land," said Polly Trottenberg.

The service runs from 24th Avenue and Bay 38th Street in Gravesend towards Canarsie on Kings Highway, ending at Seaview Avenue and Pennsylvania Avenue in Starrett City.

The new B82 Select Bus Service follows the existing limited and local routes for the most part, but at Flatbush Avenue and Kings Highway it will now continue on Kings Highway and service a new stop turning onto Avenue K and continuing on Flatlands Avenue at Utica Avenue.

The local service will continue to run the original route by turning from Kings Highway onto Flatbush Avenue and then again onto Flatlands Avenue.

The select and local services will run in both directions on Glenwood Road between Rockaway Parkway and E. 103rd Street but the buses will no longer run along Flatlands Avenue there.

The local service will also continue to serve Cropsey Avenue and Coney Island as well as Flatlands Avenue between Flatbush and Utica avenues.

The transit authority also announced an increase in off-peak service on the B17 local route, which runs from Canarsie to Crown Heights, beginning Sept. 30.

This route will have increased midday service during weekdays from every 20 or 10 minutes to every eight-and-a-half minutes, according to the transit authority.

There will also be reductions in wait times on Saturdays and Sundays for the routes, the transit authority said in the press release.

The B17 transports some 10,000 straphangers during weekdays and could get busier during the upcoming L train tunnel closure in April 2019, because it connects Canarsie to alternative subway lines, namely the 2, 4, and 5 trains at Utica Avenue Station.

This is in addition to the recently announced L5 bus which the transit authority will introduce ahead of the L train tunnel closure to direct more riders to the subway alternatives during weekday peak hours along the same route.

Brighton Beach Samaritan is Beep's 'Hero of the Month'

He's one of the borough's true heroes!

A Brighton Beach man received yet another civic award on Sept. 24 for rescuing a family out of a car crash in Sheepshead Bay last May.

Borough President Adams presented Garry Danilov with the "Hero of the Month" award for May at a Borough Hall ceremony honoring several local heroes. Danilov, an immigrant from the former Soviet Union, said it was an honor to receive the award.

"I feel honored and I greatly appreciate the award," he said.

The father-of-three was on his way to bring a cake to his twins' birthday party on May 27 when two cars collided at the intersection of Bedford Avenue and Avenue W and, without thinking twice about it, Danilov got out of his car and helped the victims in the wreck to safety before the

emergency services arrived, according to his wife Marianna.

"He saw a huge accident on Bedford Avenue, there was a whole family in the car, he couldn't get them out so he broke one of the car windows to get them out," said the native Brighton Beacher.

The local hero previously received an award from the 61st Precinct for his brave efforts.

The car rescue wasn't Danilov's first dangerous encounter. Back in 2014, he was shot during an argument in a Bensonhurst Park.

Marianna said she was very worried about her husband getting into harm's way on both occasions, but that it is in his nature to help out in emergencies.

"I was very nervous, I was quite upset because we have three kids, 8-year-old twins, David and Sasha, and 3-year-old Izabella. He did that be-

cause it's his personality," she said, and added that the kids are proud of their dad.

"They're very proud of him, and they told all their teachers," Marianna said.

At the Borough Hall ceremony honoring recent "monthly" heroes, the Beep said that the locals he has recognized exemplified the greatness of the borough and the city at large, and called them the tip of the hero iceberg.

"When you look at these stories, they really personify what makes this borough and this city such a great place: extraordinary people doing extraordinary things and going beyond the call of duty to make life better for countless New Yorkers. They're representative of a larger body of people in our communities who go unnoticed, who extend themselves with their financial and human capital to make a difference," Adams said in a press release.





Chile peppers fest at Garden

This festival packed the heat!

Thousands of spicy-food fans filled the Brooklyn Botanic Garden on Saturday for its 26th-annual Chile Pepper Festival, where the event's pairing of zesty cuisine with sizzling musical sounds kept attendees fired up all day long, according to a pepper appreciator.

"It was great to come out, enjoy the weather, and experience all the food tastings and great music," said Katie Ulin, who traveled to the Crown Heights green space from

Manhattan with her husband Rudy and 3-year-old daughter Amalia.

More than 40 vendors set up stations inside the horticultural museum at this year's affair, serving samples of salsas, hot sauces, and spicy sweets including pepper-packed chocolates.

But showcasing products to a crowd of target customers is only one benefit of the festival, according to a condiment maker, who said the yearly event provides entrepreneurs with an opportunity to swap stories and reconnect.

"It's a community of makers who enjoy spicy food, so there's also that aspect," said drag queen Shaquanda Coco Mulatta, who sold her eponymous brand of hot sauce at the bash.

And the festival's flavor wasn't contained to cuisine — six musical acts from around the country and world, including Guatemalan reggae sensation Doctor Nativo, Grammy-winning Cajun rockers Lost Bayou Ramblers, and African funk gurus Dahka Band featuring Kheswa, provided a soundtrack for the seven-hour soiree.



Do-gooders repeat heroic firefighter's run

It was a run to remember!

More than 30,000 do-gooders from around the world descended on Red Hook on Sept. 30 for a 5k walk-run fund-raiser that honored those firefighters and other rescuers who lost their lives responding to the 9-11 attacks 17 years ago.

This year's Tunnel to Towers run, whose route through the Brooklyn Battery Tunnel to Manhattan commemorates

the journey Park Slope firefighter Stephen Siller took to the Twin Towers on foot while wearing 60 pounds of gear that fateful day, drew droves of big-hearted Brooklynites, international participants from England, some 2,500 cadets from upstate U.S. military academy West Point, and runners representing Gold Star families who lost kin in battle — a contingent that turned out in bigger numbers than ever before,

according to an event rep.

Athletes, many of whom carried flags or ran in gear like Siller, started their trek on Richards Street, before turning onto Hamilton Avenue and then heading through the tunnel to the finish line near the World Trade Center.

The event, which organizers have staged every year since the 2001 terrorist attack, also attracted notable spectators, including former mayor

Rudy Giuliani — who was in office when the horrific incident occurred, helped the city recover in its aftermath, and now works as a personal attorney for President Trump.

Following the main event, participants mingled at a post-race celebration that included a free barbecue, performances by country musician Darryl Worley and West Point's Benny Havens Band, and watching attendee Kate-

lyn Traut walk away with keys to a brand-new car she won for collecting more donations than any other person in this year's competition.

The run raised more than \$2 million, according to a rep, which went toward the Siller Foundation, an organization the late firefighter's family established after his death to provide aid to families of heroes who dedicate their lives to serving their country.

primary after a weeks-long delay, adding that she was now focused on winning the seat in next month's general election.

"After weeks of uncertainty, it's good to finally receive word that I won the Democratic primary," Frontus said. "I am excited about moving forward toward the general election and hope that I will be able to represent this district that I love in the coming year."

The nominee received 3,792 votes to Lustig-Elgrably's 3,741, according to certified results from the City Board of Elections.

Frontus's win was an upset, since Lustig-Elgrably had the backing of his former boss Councilman Mark Treyger (D-Coney Island), Borough President Adams, and other local party leaders. The first-time politician is an adjunct professor at the Columbia University and New York University schools of social work and the founder of the Urban Neighborhood Services organization and the Coney Island Anti-Violence Collaborative.

Lustig-Elgrably thanked his supporters in a statement, adding that he will support Frontus's general-election campaign, and that he would continue to advocate for the neighborhood.

"While this is not the result we were hoping for, I fully support Dr. Mathylde Frontus and it is imperative that we keep this seat blue," he said. "From our schools to our seniors to our rights to our quality of life, there is so much at stake in this election. We must work hard to pro-

tect our community, and I will never give up my quest to keep Southern Brooklyn a great place to live."

The State Board of Elections did not release the official results of the race until more than two weeks after the primary and had not even updated its website as of press time on Oct. 1.

Frontus will go on to face Republican candidate Steve Saperstein in the Nov. 6 general election.

the construction of a mixed-use residential and commercial building on Surf Avenue between W. 22nd and W. 23rd streets. The building would have about 80 units, with about 20 of them earmarked for families making 60 percent or lower of the area median income, which would be \$43,860 or less for a one-person household, or \$62,580 for a family of four, according to the city Department of Housing Preservation and Development.

Lobel said at the meeting that the development would displace people living in 28 units on four lots — including at 3016 and 3022 W. 22nd St., plus 3017 and 3023 W. 23rd St. — but the development's environmental assessment statement and supplemental report shows that those lots contain 39 units. Lobel did not respond to an inquiry by press time about the discrepancy.

The developers are seeking a zoning change for the lots to match the nearby Special Coney Island District, which was upzoned to allow for six-to-10-story buildings, so the plan has to go through the city's year-long Uniform Land Use Review Procedure, which

kicked off with the presentation at the Sept. 26 meeting, and involves review by the community board, the borough president, the City Planning Commission, and the Council.

One board member warned reps for the developers to be ready for push-back, because locals are tired of construction and street closures that come with the neighborhood's break-neck development.

"You don't think we're a little tired of any construction right now?" asked Victor Quinones.

"Any talk of construction within the next few years, I guarantee not one resident of Coney Island will be okay with that."

The board's chairwoman said locals should hold their questions and concerns about the development until the joint meeting of the Land Use and Zoning and Housing committees on Oct. 3.

"Before this goes into an uproar, which I think it's going to be, I would suggest these gentleman come to the meeting next week with all their explanations, and we all sit down and question them then," said Joann Weiss.

The reps for the developers agreed to attend the meeting to answer locals' concerns.

Quest for Ruth

Beep wants Downtown building named for Justice Ginsburg

He's down with RBG!
Brooklyn's Municipal Building on Joralemon Street could soon bear the name of Kings County's own born-and-bred U.S. Supreme Court Justice, Ruth Bader Ginsburg, if Mayor DeBlasio signs off on the renaming recently requested by Borough President Adams.

The beep penned a letter to Hizzoner on Sept. 20 asking him to use his executive power to christen Downtown's stately, columned structure across the street from Borough Hall for the second female justice to join the country's top court in order to honor the 85-year-old while she is still writing opinions on the bench, he said.

"In an era where popular culture puts performing artists and sports stars on a public pedestal, Ruth Bader Ginsburg has risen to incredible levels of iconic admiration and love," Adams's missive

read. "Society often waits to recognize a lifetime of accomplishment until after that lifetime ends. In this case, we can honor the life and service of Ruth Bader Ginsburg during what we hope will be a long and active remaining life."

Ginsburg — whose life provided the inspiration for two films this year, the documentary "RBG" and the forthcoming drama "On the Basis of Sex" — began her journey to the Supreme Court bench in her native Flatbush, where Adams said her childhood as the daughter of Jewish immigrants is a "quintessential New York story."

She went on to study at James Madison High School, where Independent Vermont Sen. Bernie Sanders also got his diploma, before graduating from Cornell University and then Columbia University Law School, where she was first in her class.

And following her time in school, Ginsburg went on to

co-found the Women's Rights Project at the American Civil Liberties Union early in her legal career.

The octogenarian known to don gloves and intricate collars with her robes has become a national sensation in her time on the court, earning a recurring "Saturday Night Live" portrayal by Kate McKinnon and such loving nicknames as "Notorious RBG," and after celebrating her 25th year on the bench in August, the time is ripe to recognize her heroism and leadership, according to the beep.

"She has been a trailblazer and hero to many," he wrote in his letter. "She rose to the apex of her profession, staying true to her ideals and principles."

Adams's proposal, for which he also created an online petition that by the afternoon of Sept. 28 collected more than 500 signatures after launching two days earlier, comes amid a growing controversy surrounding the Supreme Court and President Trump's nominee, Judge Brett Kavanaugh — whom multiple women have accused of sexual assault — to fill its vacant seat.

Hizzoner is reviewing the request, which a slew of Brooklyn Heights pols and local leaders including state Sen. Brian Kavanaugh, Councilman Stephen Levin, and Assemblywoman Jo Anne Simon also signed, according to a spokeswoman, who said Ginsburg's is the quintessential public service success story and should be honored.

"There's no question that Justice Ginsburg's life and her legacy of public service epitomizes the very best of what makes New York great," said Marcy Miranda.


The band's road manager added that the event and other ones like it are important ways to help preserve and perpetuate Irish culture, especially among youngsters.

Knicks star docks at Bklyn marina

He makes a living at the World's Most Famous Arena, but starting this season, Lance Thomas of the New York Knicks will be spending some leisure time at Brooklyn's most famous marina.

The 6-foot-8, Brooklyn-born power forward, an avid fisherman, has chosen to dock his 40-foot boat at the Moonbeam Gateway Marina on the western edge of the Gateway National Recreation Area.

Last April, the National Park Service turned over operations of the aging lower Flatbush Avenue boatyard to Moonbeam Leasing and Management LLC, which embarked on a multi-million-dollar overhaul, including — among other changes — giving the marina a much-needed makeover, fixing floating docks and replacing old pilings, repaving the parking lot, repairing electric service, and providing new Wi-Fi and Internet access.

A master plan for the 10-

year, \$5-million-\$10-million rehab, says Moonbeam's CEO, calls for the installation of a new entrance, security booth, sales office, clubhouse, café and bathrooms, expansion of the marina's current capacity from 500 boat slips to 800, and rebuilding the bulkhead to accommodate super yachts up to 100 feet long.

"This is the most beautiful site in Brooklyn, and it's the largest marina in New York Harbor by far," said Steven Maksin. "We intend to beautify, improve, and expand this hidden jewel's facilities in order to better serve the community, raise the marina's profile, and provide the highest quality recreational services to boaters from New York City and elsewhere."

Maksin said berthing fees at Moonbeam Gateway will be \$100 per foot in the summer, \$50 a foot in winter.

"Keeping a 40-foot boat in storage, including hull and launch, for an entire winter

will only cost \$2,000," he said. "At that rate it's the cheapest game in town."

Thomas didn't need to see the finished product to decide that the reborn marina was the right place to berth the boat he usually keeps in Venice, La., about 75 miles from his offseason home in New

Orleans.

"I was told there were marinas in Manhattan, on the West Side," the player said. "But when I got to [Moonbeam], I immediately saw how nice it was, and how friendly the staff is. My boat is 40 feet, with a 12-foot beam. I need a dock with space. Now that

I've found Moonbeam, I'm going to keep it here every time I bring it from Louisiana. My boat is an extension of myself; I'm not going to leave it at a place where it wouldn't be properly taken care of."



Cuomo endorses Gounardes for state Senate

He got the governor's seal of approval.

Southern Brooklynites must elect Andrew Gounardes to the state Senate instead of incumbent state Sen. Marty Golden (R-Bay Ridge) in order to restore power to the Democrats in the upper chamber and help fight President Trump's agenda on the state level, Gov. Cuomo said at an Oct. 2 rally in Bensonhurst for his preferred candidate.

"We have to elect a Democratic Senate in Albany, because when they pass these crazy Washington laws, the only protection we're going to have is if we can pass a state law that thwarts the federal law," Cuomo said. "Sen. Gounardes is going to be in Albany in January and we're going to start to take this country back."

If Gounardes wins election in the 22nd district — which covers Bay Ridge, Dyker Heights, Bensonhurst, Marine Park, Gerritsen Beach, Gravesend, and parts of Sheepshead Bay, Borough Park, and Midwood — it could knock the Republicans out of power in

the state Senate, since they have only one more vote than the Democrats in the upper chamber.

At the rally — held at the Stars and Stripes Democratic Club on 15th Avenue between 73rd and 74th streets — the governor never mentioned the borough delegation's sole Republican by name, but nevertheless insisted that it was time for the eight-term incumbent to give up his seat in Albany, implying that his controversial policy proposals and past gaffes mirror President Trump's discriminatory stances and divisive rhetoric.

"We're going to take the last Republican senator out of Brooklyn this election," Cuomo said. "Elections matter, and this one really, really matters. This is about basic principles — this is about fairness, this is about opportunity, this is about discrimination."

Golden and the governor most recently sparred in the press this past summer. Cuomo said that the local pol was not doing enough to get the speed camera bill passed, accusing him of "playing

politics with the lives of children," and Golden shot back at a press conference a day later, blaming Cuomo for failing to call both the state Senate and the Assembly back to a special session to vote on the bill.

At Tuesday's rally, Gounardes followed Cuomo's lead

by tying Golden and his fellow Republican state Senators to President Trump, alleging that Golden and his peers cast aside the concerns of their constituents to promote Trump's policies on the local level.

"Marty Golden and the Senate Republicans have de-


clared war on working people and middle-class families here in our neighborhood," Gounardes said. "They've embraced the hateful rhetoric of Donald Trump and his hateful policies, and their values do not represent the values of Southern Brooklyn, plain and simple."

At the end of the event, Gounardes and the governor put their promises on paper, signing an eight-point plan to work together in Albany to pass the speed camera bill, a state law protecting abortion rights, and the country's first law that would allow teachers and school administrators to ask courts to temporarily seize firearms from individuals who could be dangerous.

Gounardes beat out former journalist Ross Barkan for the Democratic nomination in the Sept. 13 primary by a 14-point margin, powered by the support of borough Democratic Party boss Frank Seddio — who was also at the Oct. 2 rally — and other local party leaders.

Gounardes will face off against Golden in the Nov. 6 general election.

Proxies prevail over party progressives

The twice-yearly Kings County Democratic County Committee meeting on Sept. 27 descended into chaos amid boos and shouts of “Shame!” when its chairman again pulled out handfuls of proxies from his back pocket to overrule the hundreds of rank-and-file members who packed the room — a tactic used all too often by the party machine to prevent much-needed reforms, especially during a time when democracy is being challenged across the country, according to one county committee member.

“For the first time in history, last night a majority of the votes at the county committee meeting were not proxies held by the party boss. But the party lied again and acted like the boss had enough proxies to continue his rule,” said Greenpoint District Leader and New Kings Democrats club member **Nick Rizzo**, referring to chairman **Frank Seddio**. “We find ourselves in a grave national crisis and the Brooklyn Democratic Party is not helping. If we are to preserve our freedoms, the people of Brooklyn must capture our Democratic Party as soon as possible.”

The meeting at Kingsborough Community College in Manhattan Beach came on the heels of a controversial letter Seddio sent out the previous week asking hundreds of county committee members to hand over their votes to him by signing their names to proxy cards and mailing them to him ahead of the meeting. The hefty stack of proxies gave Seddio the decisive role in Thursday’s votes to nominate judges for the ballot in November, as well as the selection of the county party’s 13 elected officers.

The letter requesting the proxies was supposedly co-signed by several district leaders who say they never approved it, and a few of their names were even misspelled, according to Park Slope District Leader **Douglas Schneider**, who accused Seddio of trying to manipulate voters in order to retain his power and nominate his own slate of judges.

“If you got a letter purportedly from **Lori Citron Knipel**, [Park Slope Assemblyman **Bobby Carroll**] and me asking you to give a proxy to Frank Seddio, it wasn’t sent or approved by us. For future reference, you can tell

by checking if ‘I’ repeatedly spelled my own name wrong,” he wrote on Twitter.

At the meeting, Carroll and Brooklyn Heights district leader, **Josh Skaller**, proposed a pair of reforms to put an end to what many see as a corrupt proxy system — similar to one other county committee members tried to pass in 2016. One proposed rule would require any proxy-request letter to encourage members to attend the meeting rather than just send back the proxy card, and to clearly state that by signing it over to someone else, they are giving up their vote. The second rule proposes limiting the number of proxies one person is allowed to hold based on the Assembly District in which they live.

The hundreds of county committee members in the room overwhelmingly shouted “aye” in support of the two reforms, but they must first be reviewed by the party’s rules committee in January, according to party spokesman **Bob Liff**.

Members of several self-described progressive political clubs also want to overhaul the party’s slate of 13 elected officers — some of whom had no idea they even held such a role, according to New Kings Democrats President **Brandon West**, who said the officers’ names are kept so private that he had to send a Freedom of Information request just to get the full list.

“We talked to some people who were on this list. They didn’t know they were officers of the party,” said West. “We consider this to be a problem.”

Ultimately, the party boss’s slate of officers was again re-elected after he pulled out his some-500 proxies to overrule the rank-and-file members in the room who, according to party leaders, didn’t “overcome” the chairman’s weighted vote. But Seddio did suffer one defeat when district leaders

nominated attorney **Rupert Barry** for countywide judge instead of his handpicked lawyer, **David Pepper**.

Seddio was also re-elected as chairman of the executive committee by the District Leaders at the end of the meeting.

Nonetheless, one state pol blasted the party boss for handpicking the borough’s judges — especially when he chooses white justices in overwhelmingly black and Latino districts.

“How can we sit here today with 500 some odd of you sitting here, and Frank Seddio is sitting with more proxies than there are people here?” said Assemblyman **Charles Barron** (D-East New York), who is also a District Leader, in between shouts of getting denounced as an anti-Semite by fellow District Leader **David Schwartz**. “In the fourth judicial district, a black and Latino district, Frank Seddio has 5,900 weighted votes — whatever the hell that means — and he’s gonna select a white judge for a black district. Frank Seddio has complete control — judges have to kiss his ring in order to get a judgeship. That day must end.”

The meeting was led by former Brooklyn Heights state Sen. **Marty Connor** — who also served as counsel to the now defunct Independent Democratic Conference, but never introduced himself to the crowd when he got on stage — but began in disarray. The 6 pm start time was delayed for more than two hours while party staff rushed to scan in all the proxies into just one computer.

County committee members continued booing and shouting “Shame!” throughout the meeting, which ended after 11 pm, and one member screamed at Connor as he seemed to evade questions and allegedly bent rules throughout the night, “You are so f----- corrupt it’s unbelievable.”

City extends deadline for public's jail plan comments

Officials are giving locals more time to provide written comments on the city's plan to replace Atlantic Avenue's House of Detention with a jail eight times its size, setting a new Oct. 29 deadline for feedback.

The two-week extension of the previous Oct. 15 deadline came weeks after a public meeting on the scheme drew a standing-room-only crowd of people who largely blasted Mayor DeBlasio's proposal to build a jail as high as 40 stories with the square footage of roughly 24 football fields, and with about half a football field's worth of space for community organizations or potential retailers, in his quest to cut the population of inmates locked up on Rikers Island in half over the next decade.

But in order to break ground, officials must first sign off on a rezoning of the current House of D lot and three companion sites in Manhattan, Queens, and the Bronx, as part of a collective Uniform Land Use Review Procedure that will unfold in each borough the facilities would be located in — which could kick off as early as the end of this year, after locals' written comments are received and Department of Correction officials wrap up similar community meetings in those three outer boroughs. *Written comments on the proposal can be submitted to Howard Fiedler at 75-20 Astoria Blvd., Suite 160, East Elmhurst, NY 11370, or e-mailed to boroughplan@doc.nyc.gov.*







Coney Hospital's new 11-story tower takes step forward

Call it an expensive bill of health.

The city Health + Hospitals' \$738 million application to build a new 11-story tower the size of more than six football fields at Coney Island Hospital is one step closer to approval by the State Department of Health.

The Health Department recommended its Public Health and Health Planning Council's Establishment and Project Review Committee — which reviews applications involving construction and other proposals — advance the application to the full Council at its Sept. 27 meeting, according to Crain's New York. The full Council will meet to finally approve or deny the application on Oct. 11.

The new building — dubbed the Critical Services Structure — would contain a flood-resistant emergency department complete with X-ray, computerized axial tomography, magnetic-resonance imaging, a pharmacy, and lab services. The work would also include the demolition of a 108-year-old patient care building and an 84-year-old engineering building — both of which were significantly damaged by Hurricane Sandy — according to Construction Dive, which added that the work would also include partial renovations of the main hospital to add flood mitigation features. The 371-bed hospital will lose 20 beds to construction, Construction Dive also reported.

The construction would be funded by a \$923 million Federal Emergency Management Agency grant — which would also fund a massive, 1,720-foot flood wall surrounding the hospital campus to protect it from future superstorms.

The renovations would cap off the hospital's years-long initiative to rebuild and strengthen its image after getting hit hard by the hurricane — and a barrage of negative press after a series of serious hospital workers' missteps went public: in 2016, the city ousted the hospital's leadership after a patient died when emergency room staff allegedly mistook meningitis for a bad reaction to synthetic marijuana. And a city investigation the same year found that the hospital had hired 450 people — mostly nurses — without proper authorization. Then, a former doctor at the hospital slammed its patient care and supervision, saying it endangered kids, in an anonymous interview with the New York Post.


But last year, the hospital started a complete revamp of its emergency room protocols, by reducing wait times with a new triage system, expanding its night and weekend hours, and equipping staff with iPads and other new technology.

Construction on the new hospital tower would begin in December, and the project would wrap up by April 2023, according to Crain's.

Health + Hospitals system did not respond to repeated inquiries by press time.


The third-floor music room has a mirrored fireplace, according to the listing, and original crystal chandeliers

Kosher and halal school-lunch program a go

Some students will be able to have halal and kosher school lunches soon.

Councilman Chaim Deutsch (D-Sheepshead Bay) has announced a pilot program that will introduce new menu options for kids at a selection of schools across the city.

The councilman has secured \$1 million in the Council's budget to institute the program, which is the first of its kind in the city and will start at a small number of public and private schools, according to a spokeswoman for the councilman.

The program will aim to make school lunches more accessible to kids that eat according to Muslim and Jewish dietary restrictions, according to Deutsch.

"Universal free lunch in New York City schools is not truly universal until every child, in every school, regardless of religious dietary restrictions, is provided with a healthy, filling meal," he said in a press release.

Deutsch announced the program outside City Hall on Sept. 4, where he was joined in support by city and state pols, as well as advocates from the Jewish and Muslim communities.

Deutsch is still working out the details of the program, but he hopes to be serving kosher and halal meals by the end of the year, according to a spokeswoman for the councilman.

The current plan is for two public and two private schools across the city to take on the initiative, according to the spokeswoman.

Woman dies after passing out at Brooklyn Crab

A woman passed out at Red Hook's Brooklyn Crab restaurant and later died on Sept. 28.

Police arrived at the popular Reed Street seafood eatery during lunchtime at 12:20 pm after a 911 caller reported 25-year-old Franchesca Lizandro was struggling to breathe, and found her unconscious and

unresponsive, according to cops, who said she showed no obvious signs of trauma.

Paramedics then rushed Lizandro, who a Police Department spokeswoman said may have been a restaurant employee, to Methodist Hospital, where doctors declared her dead, authorities said.

The medical examiner has

yet to determine a cause of death, according to a separate department spokeswoman, who said Lizandro had a history of medical episodes related to asthma.

A manager at Brooklyn Crab said the restaurant would not comment on the incident.

Testing the waters

Coney Islanders demand city include neighborhood in ferry expansion study

They'll fight for a ferry — come hell or high water.

The city must honor Mayor DeBlasio's promise to consider putting a ferry stop in Coney Island as part of its upcoming feasibility study, locals demanded at an Oct. 3 rally sponsored by the Alliance for Coney Island on the Riegelmann Boardwalk at W. 22nd Street. A ferry stop in the People's Playground would help connect locals to the distant isle of Manhattan with a better — and faster — alternative than the subway, according to the unofficial "Mayor of Coney Island."

"For Coney Island, instead of an hour to an hour-and-a-half commute by subway, the idea that something scenic could get here from Manhattan in 20 or 30 minutes is a no-brainer," said Dick Zigun, who's also founder of the Coney Island Circus Sideshow.

At a town hall in the nabe last year, Hizzoner said the city would study the possibility of putting a ferry landing on the peninsula as part of the new study. But the Economic Development Corporation, which is spearheading the study, is instead relying on the public's suggestions to determine which sites to include in the study. New Yorkers can submit their suggestions through the online form until Oct. 15.

The study will consider factors including water depths, population density, existing transit access, and travel-time comparisons between existing travel options. The first stage of the process will also include meetings with elected officials and community board members from waterfront communities, according to the agency.

Coney Islanders have been complaining about the lack of

a ferry stop on their waters since the service launched last year, with residents and pols saying the ferry would help facilitate tourism and the area's ongoing development. Zigun echoed these assertions at the rally.

"We're at the end of one of the outer boroughs and we all know that there's transportation issues in New York City," he said. "And it's not just for tourists — there's a lot of residential housing under construction in Coney Island."

A 2012 study considered launching a ferry service to Coney, evaluating a derelict fishing pier at W. 21st Street near Neptune Avenue in Coney Island Creek, plus Steeplechase Pier and another ocean dock off of W. Eighth Street. But the city rejected the locations, saying the creek dock would be too far from the amusement district

and that the oceanfront stops would be too expensive. The report also concluded that ferry ridership would be seasonal, and "primarily used for recreation rather than by commuters."

But one local who said she used to trek an hour-and-a-half on the bus from the neighborhood to her job in Manhattan said she would have used the ferry to commute, adding that the ride would have offered a more scenic route for locals than the buses and subways.

"We're oceanfront, and it would be nice to have a ferry," said Selena Grant.

Another local agreed that the waterfront community should get a ferry stop, adding that she currently has to rely on the city's unreliable Access-a-Ride service to get into Manhattan for her appointments, and that she would prefer a more enjoyable ride into the city.

"We need another mode of transportation — every waterfront has a ferry, why not Coney Island?" asked Kumali Zairee. "I love the water, so I'd love the ferry."



Though aging increases a person's risk for type 2 diabetes, a healthy lifestyle that includes routine exercise and a healthy diet can help men and women reduce that risk significantly.

How to reduce your risk for diabetes

Millions of people across the globe suffer from diabetes, a term used to describe a group of metabolic diseases in which a person has high blood pressure resulting from the body's cells not responding properly to insulin or inadequate insulin production. According to researchers at Australia's Baker IDI Heart and Diabetes Institute, if the spread of type 2 diabetes continues at its current rate, there will be roughly 439 million adults with diabetes across the globe in the year 2030. Though some cases of diabetes cannot be prevented, a healthy lifestyle can prevent or delay the onset of type 2 diabetes.

Type 2 diabetes is the most common form of diabetes, occurring because the body does not use insulin properly. Initially, the pancreas will make extra insulin to account for the body's resistance to insulin, but over time the pancreas cannot produce enough insulin to maintain normal blood glucose levels. The risk of developing type 2 diabetes increases as people age, and while there is no way to halt the aging process, there are many other ways for men, women, and children to reduce their risks of developing type 2 diabetes.

Shed those extra pounds

Being overweight increases

your risk for a host of ailments, including type 2 diabetes, heart disease, and stroke. According to the American Diabetes Association, losing as little as 10 to 15 pounds can make a significant difference for people looking to reduce their risks of developing type 2 diabetes. When attempting to lose weight, recognize that making lifestyle changes is a more effective way to shed pounds and keep weight off than fad diets that may promise quick weight loss but tend to be less effective at keeping that weight off over the long haul. Successful weight loss typically involves a combination of physical activity and a healthy diet. Include physical activity as part of your daily routine several days per week, taking it slow at first if you have not exercised regularly in quite some time. As your body begins to adapt to exercise, you can gradually increase the intensity of your workout routines.

Adopting a healthy diet is another way to lose weight and maintain that weight loss. A diet low in calories and fat is a good start. Men and women who need to lose a significant amount of weight may want to work with a dietitian or nutritionist to create a meal plan that is likely to produce the best results and address any vitamin or nutrient deficiencies they might have.

Focus on fiber

Adding more fiber to your diet is another way to prevent or delay the onset of type 2 diabetes. Foods that are high in fiber tend to make people feel fuller, reducing the likelihood that you will overeat. Fiber also helps the body control its blood sugar levels, and fiber can lower a person's risk of heart disease. Many foods include fiber, but some high-fiber foods include beans, fruits, nuts, and vegetables.

Avoid refined carbohydrates

Studies have shown that diets rich in refined carbohydrates increase a person's risk of developing diabetes, while additional studies have shown that diets rich in whole grains protect the body against diabetes. Researchers examining the results of several studies that explored the relationship between whole grains and diabetes found that eating an extra two servings of whole grains each day can reduce a person's risk of type 2 diabetes by as much as 21 percent. Refined carbohydrates, which can be found in white bread, white rice, mashed potatoes and many cereals, cause sustained spikes in blood sugar and insulin levels, which can increase a person's risk of diabetes.

Smart sugar substitutes for diabetics

Monitoring glucose levels in the blood to ensure they are at an acceptable level is a vital task in a diabetic's life. Unstable levels can mean the difference between living a healthy life or illness and even death.

Eating a healthy diet, staying hydrated with plenty of water, and possibly using medication or insulin injections are a few of the ways to maintain one's glucose levels.

When a diabetic eats, the sugar in her food is digested into glucose. Sugar is normally used by cells for energy. Insulin is a hormone that is secreted by the pancreas and helps regulate the metabolism of carbohydrates and fats while removing excess glucose from the blood, which could prove toxic. Individuals who have no insulin production (type 1 diabetes) and those whose insulin is inefficient at moving sugar out of the bloodstream (type 2 diabetes) may have to take insulin and regulate their sugar intake to keep the body in balance.

Although having diabetes means a lifelong regimen of watching what you eat, it does not mean you can't enjoy your diet. Thanks to a wide variety of sugar substitutes, most diabetics can indulge in desserts and other foods in moderation.

For those ready to satisfy their sweet tooth, here are some sweeteners that are approved by the American Diabetes Association.

Sucralose: This sweetener, which often goes by the brand name Splenda(R), is one of the more popular supplements. The body does not recognize sucralose as a carbohydrate or a sugar, which means it will not be metabolized as such. Sucralose is heat-resistant, which means it can be used for cooking and baking.

Stevia: Relatively new to the commercial market, stevia is an all-natural sweetener, unlike many of the other sugar substitutes. It comes from a South American plant of the same name and has a strong track record of safety. The sweetener has zero calories and no glycemic index.

Saccharine: Saccharine is also safe, but diabetics must only consume it in small amounts. It also can be mixed with hot or cold food.

Aspartame: This sweetener also has zero calories and is found in many foods and beverages. However, aspartame is best avoided when baking because it loses sweetness when heated.

Acesulfame potassium: A little goes a long way with this product because it is much sweeter than sugar. It is also usually combined with other sweeteners because it can have a bitter aftertaste.

Not all sugar substitutes are good for diabetics, however. The Mayo Clinic warns that sugar alcohols, particularly mannitol, sorbitol, and xylitol, can increase blood sugar levels. These products also may cause stomach discomfort and diarrhea.

Navigating holidays with diabetes

Amid a season of sweets and special foods, it sometimes can be challenging for diabetics to maintain their dietary discipline. But eating certain foods in moderation can help people with diabetes enjoy the flavors of the holidays without compromising their health.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention says more than 29 million people in the United States have diabetes, while another 86 million adults have pre-diabetes. One in four people with diabetes do not know they have the disease.

Managing diabetes is more than just avoiding candy and cookies. Foods with a lot of fat or those that are high in carbohydrates also can be problematic. Such foods may not be so easy to avoid come the holiday season, but the following are a few tips to help men and women with diabetes maintain their health through the holidays:

Anticipate foods. Certain foods are staples of the holiday season. If you anticipate potentially problematic foods,

then you can develop a plan to avoid them or eat them in moderation in advance of arriving at a family gathering or holiday party.

Eat a healthy snack. Prior to going to a holiday party, eat something that will satisfy your hunger to avoid overeating once you are there.

Ask about foods. Don't be shy to ask the host or hostess about what will be served. This will help you develop a strategy that will fit your meal plan.

Limit alcohol consumption. Only drink in moderation and eat something beforehand to prevent low blood glucose levels later. Avoid drinks with high calorie mixers or ones packed with extra sugar.

Bring a dish. Make something that is diabetic-friendly and bring it to the party. Chances are someone else attending the party is diabetic and will appreciate having a healthy choice as well.

Opt for fruit. Choose fruit over sweets at the dessert ta-

ble. If you bring a baked good, consider recipes with reduced sugar or ones that use a sugar substitute.

blood-sugar levels like a hawk. Monitor your levels more closely so you can see how holiday foods are affecting your levels and so you know if you need to make any adjustments.

Rebound quickly. Experts advise that if you go overboard on a particular day, get back on your feet

Understanding the role insulin plays in the body



Insulin plays a key role in metabolic functions in the body. People with diabetes have an intimate knowledge of insulin, particularly if they do not produce enough naturally. However, the rest of the public may be less knowledgeable about the role of insulin and its impact on overall health.

Insulin is produced in the pancreas of the human body. Its most important function is the way it interacts with glucose (blood sugar) to allow the cells of the body to use that glucose as energy.

Insulin can be viewed as a type of key that unlocks the cells and enables glucose to enter. The pancreas senses when there is a spike in glucose in the bloodstream and reacts by producing insulin.

According to the Hormone Health Network, insulin also works to ensure the liver stores

excess glucose so that it is not actively in the blood. Stored glucose is called glycogen. This glycogen can be converted into fat when it is needed. Insulin also affects other metabolic processes, such as the breakdown of protein or fat.

If insulin is not being produced in the right amounts, the result is high blood sugar, or hyperglycemia. Chronic hyperglycemia is the hallmark of diabetes mellitus.

Complications of high blood sugar include damage to the nervous system, kidneys, eyes, and the extremities.

Type 1 diabetes occurs when the pancreas fails to produce enough insulin. Supplementation with insulin will be necessary to avoid drastic changes in blood glucose levels.

When a person has type 2 diabetes, cells fail to respond to insulin properly. This is re-

ferred to as insulin resistance.

As the disease progresses, a lack of insulin may also develop. Typically with this type of diabetes, excessive body weight and not enough exercise are the culprits in insulin resistance.

Eating a healthier diet and becoming more physically active can help reverse the condition.

Too little glucose in the blood (hypoglycemia) can make a person feel irritable, tired, or confused. Low blood sugar can lead to loss of consciousness. That is why it is crucial that blood sugar concentrations remain relatively stable.

Without insulin, the body could not effectively make use of the energy obtained through eating and drinking. Insulin helps unlock cells so that glucose can be used to its full potential.



How diabetes affects vision



Routine eye examinations can help doctors diagnose diabetes early. Such examinations also are important in the management of the disease and the prevention of vision loss.

Diabetes affects 23.6 million people in the United States and close to three million people in Canada. While diabetes can be accompanied by many different symptoms, some people are surprised to learn that diabetes can affect the eyes and vision.

Changes in vision are sometimes the earliest warning signs of the presence of diabetes or pre-diabetes. Diabetic eye disease is its own stand-alone condition, and the National Eye Institute points out that diabetic eye disease comprises a group of eye conditions that affect people with diabetes. These may include retinopathy, macular edema, cataracts, and glaucoma. All forms of eye disease can potentially cause severe vision loss or blindness.

Those with diabetes also can experience xanthelasma, or yellowish collections of cholesterol around the eye

area. What's more, diabetes can put individuals at risk of developing conjunctival bacterial infections (pink eye), as well as corneal erosions, corneal defects, and subsequent dry eyes.

According to the American Diabetes Association, people with diabetes are at a 40-percent greater risk of suffering from glaucoma than people without diabetes. The longer someone has had diabetes, the more common glaucoma is. Diabetics also are 60 percent more likely to develop cataracts. Vision checkups and care are an important part of living with diabetes.

Routine eye examinations can head off potential vision problems and have been known to alert doctors to the presence of diabetes before patients know they have it. During a comprehensive dilated eye exam, eye doctors will examine all areas of the eye

to check for illness. Pressure on the eye will be tested, as glaucoma can cause elevated pressure. The doctor also will check for any clouding of the eye lens.

When an eye is dilated, doctors can examine the retina at the rear of the eye. Points that will be checked include:

- Changes to blood vessels, including any leaking blood vessels or fatty deposits
- Swelling of the macula

- Damage to nerve tissue
- Health of the retina, and whether there are any tears or detachments

While many of the vision loss problems associated with diabetes are irreversible, early detection and treatment can reduce the risk of blindness by 95 percent, advises the National Eye Institute. Controlling diabetes slows the onset and worsening of visual symptoms. People with diabe-

tes may need to see their eye doctors more frequently and have a greater number of dilated exams to ensure eyes are still in good health.

To keep diabetes in check, follow a doctor-recommended diet, monitor your blood-sugar levels, and get plenty of exercise. Eye doctors and primary care providers can work together to ensure that all symptoms of diabetes are treated effectively.

Lower blood-sugar levels without use of medication

Diabetes is a disorder in which the body cannot properly store and use the energy found in food. To be more specific, diabetes compromises the body's ability to use glucose.

According to MediLexicon International, type 1 diabetes is an autoimmune disease in which the body wrongly identifies and then attacks pancreatic cells, which causes little to no insulin production. Those with type 1 diabetes usually must rely on insulin shots to remain healthy.

Type 2 diabetes involves insulin resistance or insufficient insulin production and is the more common form of diabetes. The pancreas may still produce insulin, but not enough to meet the demands of the body. Insulin resistance occurs in some cases because a consistent high blood-glucose level causes cells to be overexposed to insulin and

then makes cells less responsive or immune to its effects.

Diabetes treatment can include a combination of strategies, including the following non-drug remedies:

Diet

Diabetics can work with their doctors and nutritionists to come up with a diet that will be most effective. Some advocate for eating foods that are low in carbohydrates or ones with a low glycemic index. Others say that it is more important to restrict caloric intake rather than sugar intake.

Work with a professional to create a healthy diet and follow it as closely as possible. Eat meals at the same time each day so you can better regulate blood-sugar spikes and lulls. Skipping meals may cause you to overeat later in the day, which can throw glucose levels off-kilter.


Exercise

Many people with type 2 diabetes are carrying around extra weight. Exercise can help them shed pounds and maintain healthier weights.

But exercise does more than just help you lose weight. The Joslin Diabetes Center says strength training exercises are an important component of workouts. By maintaining lean muscle mass, you can get rid of a larger amount of glucose in the bloodstream, thus helping manage diabetes in the process. Get at least 20 to 30 minutes of moderate activity several days per week.

Supplementation

Some people find that certain natural ingredients can help regulate blood-sugar levels. For example, pure, organic apple cider vinegar taken over time can help people with diabetes manage their blood-

sugar levels more effectively.

A small amount of cinnamon per day may be able to reduce fasting glucose levels

by anywhere from 18 to 29 percent, according to a study in the *Journal of Agricultural and Food Chemistry*.

The relationship between obesity and type 2 diabetes

Diabetes is a disease that makes it difficult for the body to manage its blood-glucose levels. Diabetes is broken down into two types: type 1 diabetes, which occurs when the pancreas cannot adequately produce enough insulin to regulate blood sugar; and type 2 diabetes, which occurs when the body either resists the effects of insulin or does not produce enough to maintain a normal blood sugar level.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention reports type 2 diabetes has been occurring with increasing frequency among American children and adolescents over the past 20 years. The Mayo Clinic says 90 percent of diabetes cases are type 2, and 80 percent of these people are overweight.

Being overweight or obese is a significant risk factor for type 2 diabetes, but many people do not know why. There is some evidence that fat cells are more resistant to insulin than muscle cells. In addition, being overweight taxes the body in other ways and can put more pressure on the body's ability to properly control blood sugar and use insulin.

Carbohydrate-rich diets full of simple sugars and refined foods can cause unhealthy spikes in blood-glucose readings. Individuals who overeat and lead sedentary lifestyles may not burn enough energy, and excess calories are then stored as fat, compounding the problem.

The Obesity Society says type 2 diabetes is largely preventable, and research shows that lifestyle changes that include small amounts of weight loss (between five and 10 percent of body weight) can prevent or delay the onset of type 2 diabetes. In fact, managing weight is the best thing a person can do to reduce their risk for diabetes. Losing as few as 10 pounds can markedly improve insulin resistance and make it much easier to manage blood sugar levels.

In addition to losing weight, eating a healthy diet and exercising regularly can reduce a person's risk of developing diabetes. Lean proteins, leafy green vegetables, and complex carbohydrates will not spike blood sugar levels. Exercise helps burn calories and boost metabolism, and may even help the body use insulin more effectively.

Band returns to Good Shepherd music series

Their music will bring Marine Park together.

ments, eventually finding Ryan.

The band has since toured the country and held residencies at a number of colleges, and is currently writing songs for a new album. One of those new tunes, "The Water Understands," hints at a more elaborate direction, with a more expansive rhythm section and an entrancing video.

Brent, a Queens native who now lives upstate, is looking forward to playing at the Marine Park church.

"The church is a gorgeous space and music sounds really beautiful in there. It's spacious so sound fills the room in a beautiful way. But it's also not too big so a small ensemble like us doesn't get swallowed up in the space," he said.

Brent has performed in the Good Shepherd fall music series for the last 11 years, performing with various jazz, bluegrass, and classical music groups, and he is excited to see the audience return year after year, he said.

"It is great to see that they still like me," he said. "I hope to see a lot of the same people I see every year and more."



The Cappuccino Café has been a Bay Ridge staple since 1981.

The restaurant recently transformed its outdoor seating area, removing the deck, and replacing it with a cement floor, new tables and chairs, and umbrellas that offer some shade. It's a great place to go for bite, and a cup of the best cappuccino in the borough. In the evening, lights illuminate the area.

No big-name coffee chain can offer anything that compares to what is served here — steaming cups of cappuccino, overflowing with whipped cream that trickles down the sides of the clear glass-footed mugs. Scoop up every last drop with a spoon because it's that good. This has always been the place to come on date night, perhaps after a movie, to linger over a cup of brew, share a decadent dessert, and enjoy good conversation at a cozy table.

Over the years, the restaurant has evolved into much more — it now calls itself the Cappuccino Café and Grill because it features a full menu of wonderful food, all reasonably priced.

The \$19.99 dinner menu, available all day, offers a choice of appetizers, entrees, and desserts for that one low cost. Start with a bowl of French onion soup, or perhaps a Caesar's salad. Entrees include eggplant rolletini stuffed with three types of cheese, or chicken parmigiana. Both are served with linguini or penne. Or, have a pork chop grilled to perfection; shrimp scampi sautéed with white wine, lemon, garlic; Chicken Francaise; or broiled tilapia oreganata. They're served with vegetables and a choice of mashed potatoes or rice. Delicious desserts are Cappuccino Café's famous brownie, served with mounds of whipped cream; the tantalizing ice cream sundae; or a waffle wedge topped with ice cream. Enjoy it with an included cup of coffee or tea.

There's a lunch special, too, from 11 am to 4 pm. For \$12.95, feast on a triple-decker sandwich of ham, turkey, American cheese, bacon, lettuce and toma-

toes; or hot grilled chicken served over Caesar's salad, with a side of fries; or a mouthwatering cheeseburger; or a generous slice of quiche with salad; or a tuna wrap. You'll get dessert, plus a fountain soda or coffee or tea.

Yes, you can still order off the menu — which includes specialty sandwiches, potato skins, fried

calamari, mozzarella sticks, and lots more.

The restaurant is owned by John Keegan and Bobby Daquara. The two business partners also own the Greenhouse Café next door, which will celebrate its 40th anniversary in 2019. Both men have worked every job in the industry, starting from when they were in high school. They

met because both toiled for the restaurants' previous owners, two brothers — Richard and Fred Abbazio. Daquara washed dishes, and Keegan was a bus boy. When the brothers decided to sell in 1990, Keegan and Daquara purchased both places, expanding and enriching the restaurants' history.

Dancing on the 'Cardboard Stage'

They are treading the cardboards!

A new multimedia dance show about feeling powerless in the face of city and national politics will storm the stage of Triskelion Arts in Greenpoint on Oct. 18–20. The Bay Ridge-raised choreographer of “Cardboard Stage” said that after the presidential election of 2016, she was compelled to create a piece that would express her feelings.

“There was a lot of political talk and a lot of protests going on at the time, and it was the start of what we see now,” said Nicole Philippidis, the artistic director of 277 Dance Project.

The name of the show was inspired by a common sight at political protests, said Philippidis: cardboard signs.

“At these protests there were always cardboard — everywhere I looked I would see cardboard signs,” she said.

The protest signs are one of the most potent ways to getting people’s attention, said Philippidis — and they use the same material that sidewalk dancers perform on.

“When you can have something to say — you can speak it or scream it, but as soon as you write it down you have an audience and a place to be seen or heard,” she said. “People make makeshift stages all the time, and as soon as you place it on the floor, people will stop and watch it. It carves out a space for a voice.”

In the show, a half-dozen dancers

will enact the day-to-day struggles of life in a rapidly changing city, against a background of ever-changing abstract visuals created by filmmaker Jennifer Klein.

For music, the choreographer teamed up with her musician brother John Philippidis, a founding member of the indie-folk band Burlap to Cashmere. He created a soundtrack for the show, and will perform it live during the three-night run.

The evening combines several different art forms with a display of talented dancers to express feelings that everyone has felt at some point,

said Philippidis.

“It’s fun, it’s wonderful live music and visual media, and a culmination of talented artists working together,” she said.

“The piece speaks to everyone and it doesn’t matter who you are or where you’re from — you’ll find something in this show and leave on a high of a shared experience.”

The food at Alamo Drafthouse Cinema is much better than it needs to be.

Once you settle into your seats at the Downtown movie theater, you are a captive audience — so the kitchen could get by with a basic burger and nachos. Instead, the bar serves a Brooklyn cocktail as good as you will find outside the Clover Club, the draft list runs to 40 beers, and the food menu features appetizers, entrees, and desserts that you would order even without a movie.

That food menu recently got an upgrade, dropping a few dishes and adding a dozen new items, including a chili-cheese dog, a steak salad, and a fried chicken sandwich, among other items. So I dragged a companion to a recent screening of Spike

Lee’s “BlacKKKlansman,” where we could chomp our way through some new dishes.

The new Ethiopian-spiced Berbere Wings (\$14) — created for “Black Panther” and added to the permanent menu — were a little dry, so I stole a slice of my friend’s Squash and Goat Cheese flatbread (\$16), which was excellent. For dessert, I decided to indulge in the donuts (\$9).

Readers, that ring of fried dough was the best thing I ate that week. Just the right amount of crunch, a soft, still warm interior, sprinkled with sweet cream, sitting on a “blueberry compote” — a tart jelly that cut right through the sweetness.

Alamo has strict rules against talking, texting, and cell phone use of any kind — and I was not about to miss the tense cat-and-mouse cop






Community Bookstore’s pick: “Ninth Street Women,” by Mary Gabriel

in the art world then or since. An eminently readable and necessary corrective to the creation myth of the macho American postwar painters!



Classified ads are intended to help people by facilitating communication and advertising available services; however, some of the hotlines & service numbers in classifieds actually hurt the people who rely on them by cheating them of their hard-earned dollars. "Most newspapers print a disclaimer in their classified ad section to warn readers about numbers that are a direct line to trouble. Any number starting with 900, 540, 595 or 871 charges a fee beyond a local call. In some instances, ads initially advertise calls to a local number, but then direct callers to a second number starting with one of the paid exchanges. "Consumers must also question the legitimacy of vague classifieds because they too could be a scam. Before responding to an ad, consumers should verify the source of all information & always be wary about sending money or signing a contract with an unknown party."


